SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON V. AUGUST 4.
THE WORTH OF THE KINGDOM.
Matt. 13:44-53.
GOLDEN TEXT.
"Seek ye first His Kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you."
Matt. 6:33.
POINTED SUGGESTIONS.
By Rev. D. W. Snider.

There is no doubt that the thing which is difficult to obtain brings with its securing a value which is peculiarly its own. And if, when it is gotten, it continues to greet you with a lustrous beauty which is like a surprise, that value is enhanced. Many things may be parted from, but it must be retained. Such is the kingdom of heaven.

Note these two or three things which are so plainly suggested in the early part of the lesson: 1. The kingdom of heaven is to be sought for. 2. It is not so readily found. 3. Its value, when found, is a surprise and a revelation. 4. It proves to be more than satisfactory—no sacrifices are considered too great to make in order to retain title to it or most surely to possess it.

Nothing can be put in the balance with the kingdom of heaven. All treasures are valueless in comparison with this treasure. No lustrous heap of pearls can match the pearl of great price.

Nevertheless, treasure as it is and pearl as it is, Jesus says the kingdom of heaven is like something else. It is a stretched out net. It is privilege. It is opportunity. It is the beneficent arrest of a soul in search of happiness, and man rejoices within its protecting meshes, also, many of them without change of character.

But that cannot always be. A time is set and a place is named where separation upon character tests is made and where irrevocable consequences follow. The value of the kingdom of heaven consists in something else than apparent fellowship in a common meeting place.

Yet, when Jesus asked the question of verse 5 concerning the ten parables He had uttered, He spoke to those who said that they understood them all. Did they?

Certainly not. Nor do we. Truth may be absolute, but it has never been given to man in its final range and reach of exceeding story. "I am Alpha and Omega." There is room within those pockets of infinite beginning and ending for treasures both new and old.

Notice the expression: "Therefore every scribe who hath been made a disciple to the kingdom of heaven." There are no graduates in the school of Christ; only students, only learners. The last word is not with the critics, lower or higher. It is with Jesus. Is anyone prepared to say at what page He will hold His discipled between the Alpha and Omega? "There of His grace? The world, no doubt, is in A. B. C's."

It is not wisdom to keep close to the One at whose feet the disciples of the kingdom sit? Have you any treasures comparable to the value of that place? Have you any pearls which are worthy to be held if their casting away may secure that advantage? No earthly title can equal this degree, namely, Disciple of Jesus.

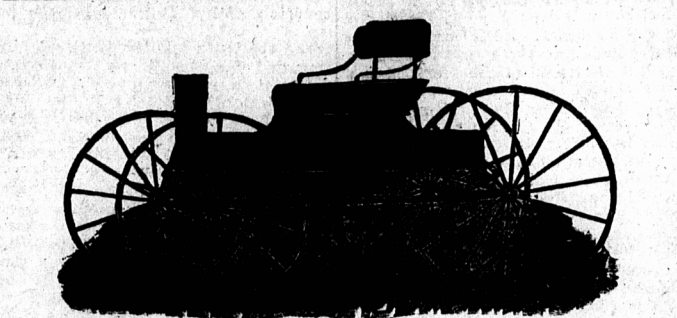

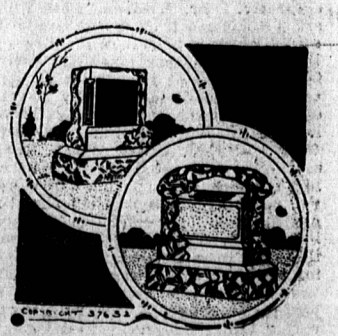

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the District and Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may, within nine miles of his homestead, on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$20.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the home stead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

Homesteader who has exhausted his homestead rights and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in a year of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$20.00.
