Morse is changing under his confinement in the toms, but has not lost his nerve and keeps himself busy with his business affairs and callers.

### AMERICAN TO SACCO INDUSTRY BIG ONE.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—Tobacco and articles coming under the Dingley tariff law were considered recently at a public hearing before the House committee on Ways and Means which has in hand the work of preparing a re-adjustment of the tariff law for presentation to a special session of Congress to be called next March. There are over 17,000 establishments in this country engaged in the manufacture of tobacco, representing an investment of nearly \$400,000,000. Employment is given to over 300,000 men.

### COST OF MADISON SQUARE GARDEN.

NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—Madison Square Garden, the largest and most widely known building in this country devoted exclusively to public entertainments, and famous also for the beauty of its architecture, is for sale. The price is said to be \$3,250,000. As it has never paid an amusement palace, it is quite certain that if sold it will be lost to the city as the home of great public amusements and political and civic mass meetings. The garden was built twenty-eight years ago. The officers of the company are: Frank K. Sturgis, president; James C. Young, secretary. Its capitalization is \$3,000,000.

### WINTERING POTATOES.

The summer of 1905 was fine warm dry season, consequently the potato crop was large and fully matured and dry. The winter of 1905 and 1906 was very mild and in all cellars which were not properly ventilated and cool the potatoes rotted very badly and when planted in the spring not half of them grew. The farmer will not soon forget how badly the potatoes missed in the spring of 1906. It will be easily understood that mature fruit will rot quickly in a warm close cellar. So that it is of great importance to the farmer to see that their root cellars are not too warm. Potatoes and apples keep well in a temperature just a little above freezing point. This year the potato crop is just exactly the same as that of 1905, and will rot just as quick and must just as badly in the spring if they are not properly cared for and the cellars kept cool and well ventilated. A word to the wise is sufficient.
