THE NILE DAM.

The great dam at Assouan, the first cataract of the Nile, has been completed—the most stupendous engineering work of the kind the world ever saw. It cost ten millions of dollars and has been completed within two years, which seems a very brief time for an enterprise of such magnitude and difficulty. Its object is to control the Nile floods, to which Egypt owes its fertility, and to afford the means of irrigating vast tracts that are now for the most part barren.

It is in Egypt that the greatest constructed works of ancient and modern times are displayed in close contrast—the Pyramids, the Suez Canal and the Nile Dam. The Great Pyramid, chief of a range including seventy smaller ones, is perhaps the most enduring and monumental work of the human race, dating back to about 4,000 years before the Christian era. It stands there, vast, imperishable, spectacular and useless. It represents the enforced toil of a nation continued during a generation, to build a tomb in which the despot of the time might be "established for eternity." In contrast with this we see how utilitarian and beneficent is the genius of the present age. The Suez Canal affords immensely shortened time and distance for the commerce of the world. The Nile Dam will furnish daily bread to feed as many thousands of freemen as there were of slaves who toiled to erect the great tomb of the greatest of the Pharaohs.

The building of the dam was the direct outcome of British control at Cairo, and the business instincts of the British race. The dam will hold back and regulate the overflow of the Nile, which was sometimes insufficient and at other times developed destructive floods. Egypt has had many lean years since and before the days of Joseph, but hereafter there will be a lessened contrast between the years of plenty and of scarcity. Egyptian farming will for all time be rendered at once more productive and more certain of its results. British control in Egypt had been already justified to the conscience of the world by its beneficent effects. It will hereafter be more fully and universally approved.

One of the features of the tedious war in the Philippines is the publication from time to time in the leading American newspapers of the views of leading men of the race which American armies are endeavoring to subjugate. A recent letter of Senor Lopez to the American Peace Society comes under this category and is a clever production. He claims for himself and his people the "inalienable right of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness," affirms that they will never give up the struggle till their national independence is secured; that they are willing to pay back to the United States the 20 millions paid to Spain; and finally that they are in a stronger position, better armed, more united, and more determined to carry on the war than ever before. "We are ready for peace," he says. "We hold out the olive branch. But on that branch is written, with the blood of brave men the word Liberty."

It is estimated that the gold production of the world this year will be 335 million dollars, or a million dollars a day. This is a vast sum, but still it would if evenly divided only give 25 cents a piece to the people now in the world.

It is a mistake where land is so plentiful to build three storey school-houses. The labor of climbing stairs is a severe tax upon both pupils and teachers, among whom there must necessarily be a percentage who are not strong. And there are serious dangers in case of fire or panic that must be taken into account. Our lofty school buildings are not equipped with fire escapes, and even if they were so equipped it would be extremely difficult to rapidly and safely remove a large number of small children from the third story by that means in time to prevent suffocation. It is in the upper storey of a building that the smoke becomes dense most quickly, where there is an open hallway from bottom to top of the structure.

A correspondent, who evidently possesses a fine sense of humor, has sent us an idea in ballooning the mails across the Straits. The idea is accompanied with well-drawn plan and specifications. First a steel cable is stretched across from Cape to Cape. The balloon is to be attached to the cable with a pulley. In this way the balloon must be carried across by the wind. A second cable is attached to the balloon by which it can be hauled back, with a windlass, against the wind. The plan is perfect—on paper. But the steel cable has yet to be constructed that will bear its own weight without drooping some hundreds of feet between the two supporting towers eight miles apart.

King Edward's speech in reply to the City of London's address shows his deep interest in the great problem of the better housing of the working classes and the poor in cities. The problem is gravest in London, but exists in all cities. Eighty per cent of all the crimes against persons and property are perpetrated by persons who have lost connection with home, or never had any home, or whose homes had ceased to be sufficiently separate, decent or desirable to afford what are the ordinary wholesome influences of home and family.
