CHARLOTTETOWN AND ELSEWHERE

A new concrete sidewalk is being laid on the South side of Richmond Street between Queen and Pownall streets in Charlottetown.

Among the freight which came to Charlottetown by the Northumberland recently were four red foxes from Antigonish for J. B. Thomas, O'Leary.

John and Mrs. McCannell and their son Evan, who have been visiting in Charlottetown, the guests of Alex and Mrs. McCannell, have left for their home in Brighton, Mass.

Dr. McPhall of Wyecoomagh, C. B., who has been on P. E. Island for a week or ten days for the purpose of purchasing foxes for his ranch in Cape Breton left Charlottetown Friday for Sydney.

A meeting of the Liberals of Charlottetown and Royalty was held Friday evening to select delegates to attend the Federal Convention for Queen's County which will probably be held next month. A splendid list of delegates was secured.

Mrs. (Dr) Conroy, Charlottetown, left Saturday morning for Montreal to visit her sister, Madame Newbury of the Sacred Heart Convent, in that city. She was accompanied by her son Fred who is on his way back to North Battleford, Sask, after spending several weeks at his home here, and her son Frank, who returns to Toronto where he holds a position in the Metropolitan Bank.

The Canadian Pictorial of September contains two splendid photographs, one of the Governor General and Princess Patricia on their way to Government House and the other of His Royal Highness acknowledging the cheers of the people as the party disembarked from the S. S. Harland. These photos were taken by Cleveland Craswell and speak highly of his talent as an amateur photographer. Some seaside scenes from Prince Edward Island taken by W. S. Louison which also appear in this number of the Pictorial show up the beautiful sea shore to splendid advantage.

The new wharf for Franklyn Point, the contract of which has been called for by the Dominion Government is to be 658 feet long. The approach, 22 feet wide, is to extend out to ten feet in low water. The width of the pier-head at the dock will be 48 feet. The shore abutments or approach with spans and intermediate block will be in all 385 feet long. The pier-head with inclined landing, floats, etc, 158 feet long, the guide piers forming a dock 115 feet long. There will be a sidewalk three feet wide and a handrail running along the sides. The pier-head will be 158 feet long and the landing slip will be 65 feet long and 17 feet wide. The two guide-piers will be 115 feet long and 24 feet wide. The four outer corners of the piers will be sheathed with 8 inch boiler plate for a width of three feet on each face for a height of 14 feet from low water. There will be 12 mooring posts 18 inches in diameter.

The Peake estate on the corner of Queen and Water Streets, one of the oldest properties in Charlottetown, has changed hands and has been purchased by Carvell Bros. who have occupied the building for about fifty years. The old buildings to the south of the main brick buildings, last occupied by Hickey & Nicholson as a tobacco factory, have been removed and are now at the rear of a fine new warehouse in course of erection where they formerly stood. This warehouse is about 70 feet in width and two old buildings which notwithstanding their age are still quite sound have been attached to the rear which gives the new buildings with these additions a total length of about 200 feet, being carried to the water's edge. The new addition will make an improvement to the appearance of that part of the town and will doubtless prove a great advantage to Carvell Bros in aiding them to carry on their largely increasing business.

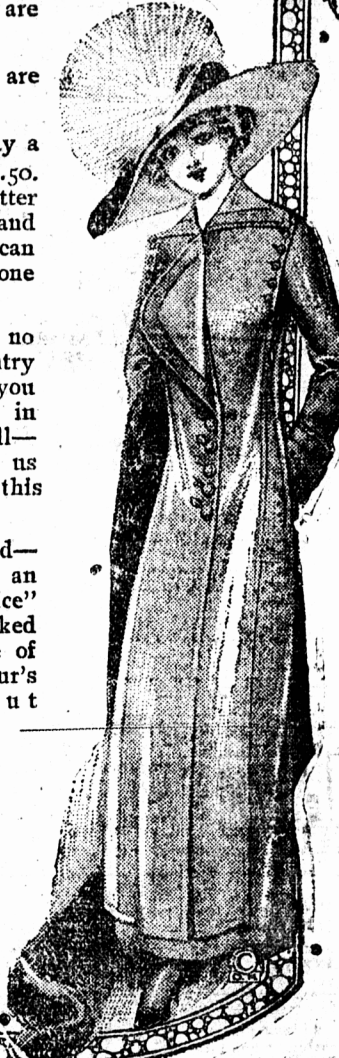
