From what has already happened during the visit of the Heir Apparent to Australia in the way of conferring titles we are left to speculate upon what may occur when the royal visit is extended to Canada. The Chief Justice of New South Wales was created a Grand Cross of the Order of St. Michael and St. George; the Administrator of Tasmania a Knight; Commander of the same Order; the Mayors of Sydney and Melbourne were created Knights Bachelors; the Premier of Tasmania, the Mayors of Adelaide, Brisbane and Hobart and the ex-Mayor of Perth were made Commanders of the Order of St. Michael and St. George. Thus the Mayors of all the capital cities in the Commonwealth were honored with titular distinctions. We have some splendid raw material in the political, judicial and civic official life of Canada and if our future King has honors to bestow we presume they will not be refused.

Australia, owing to its distance, has not been honored with royal visits so frequently as some other portions of the Colonial Empire, and consequently when a Prince of the Blood makes his appearance in that quarter he is greeted with most exuberant loyalty. About thirty-one years ago the late Prince Alfred Duke of Edinburgh paid Australia a visit, and he never afterward forgot the fervor and enthusiasm with which he was received. About twelve years later the two sons of the Prince of Wales made a hurried visit and were accorded a right royal reception. Now the Duke of York has returned, nineteen years older than he was at his former visit, and with the prestige of Heir Apparent to the throne. His reception on the present occasion has broken all records as an exhibition of spontaneous and enthusiastic loyalty.

ANOTHER FAST WARSHIP.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 18.—The battleship Wisconsin steamed into the port yesterday morning after a 48 hour trial in the Samba Channel, during which it was demonstrated that the Illinois will have to look sharp if she would retain the honor of being the swiftest sailer of the class in the United States navy. According to members of the trial board and the experts in naval construction who were aboard the Wisconsin, the battleship will show a speed of more than 18 knots an hour if put under forced draught.
