THE FREIGHT RATE EXPERT.

IT comes as a great disappointment to all our citizens to learn that the Provincial Government has refused the request of the Board of Trade in the matter of contributing to the retainer of a Maritime Freight Rate Expert, and has determined not to co-operate with Nova Scotia and New Brunswick in a joint endeavor to secure a more equitable adjustment of freight rates in the Maritimes.

The Governments of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, enthused by the success already achieved, and conscious of the extent and importance of the work remaining to be done, are co-operating in this matter and have appropriated generous sums of money to make possible the retention of Mr. Cornell's services and the continuance and furtherance of this all important work.

The extent of the monetary contribution which the Government was requested to make was small—relatively small in comparison with the sums voted in the other Provinces—in infinitesimally small in comparison with the sums which may be saved to our farmers and producers in this Province by the prosecution of this work.

A LEAKY BASKET.

POURING sand in a rat-hole and pouring water into a basket have long been proverbial as evidences of want of ordinary common sense.

A recent bulletin issued by the Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa gives an official report of the progress we are making. During the past five years, according to this bulletin, we have received into Canada 573,864 immigrants.

Why do these people, our own and our immigrants, refuse to stay in Canada? Simply because there is no employment here for them. And why is there no employment in a country so richly endowed with raw material for manufacturing and soil conditions for agriculture?

Notes by the Way

THE Federal Bureau of Statistics shows that from 1922 to 1927, inclusive, the increase of population in Canada has been less than either the natural increase or the number of immigrants who have come to this country.

Every patriotic Canadian, who thoughtfully considers these movements of population in and out of Canada, must view the situation with alarm. No other Dominion within the Empire overseas is faced with such a crisis.

The United States makes no effort to get immigrants. On the contrary, by quota laws it limits the number who may be permitted to enter and settle in that country.

It must be evident to all who have given this matter their thoughtful consideration that this wide contrast between the trade policies of the two countries has had some effect in stimulating the exodus of Canadians southward across the border.

Hon. R. B. Bennett, addressing a Conservative Association in Toronto the other day touched upon the question of immigration, strongly condemning the policy and practice of the King Government.

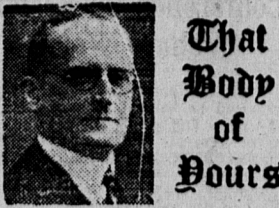

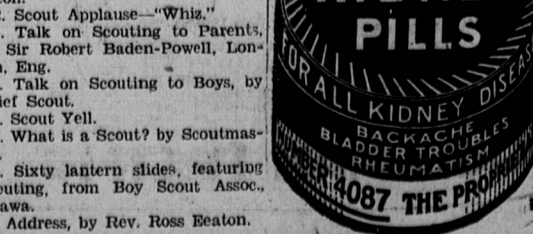
