TINORO, April 17—The preliminary investigation into the shooting of Arthur Jackson was concluded here today, and the father of the dead boy was committed for trial.

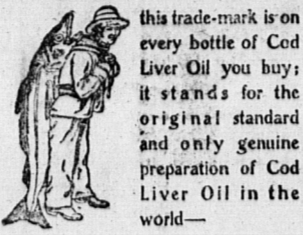
BURIAL GROUND IS NOW PART OF FARM
