P. E. ISLAND 63 YEARS AGO

Launched on Tuesday last from the shipyard of W. W. Lord, at Crapaud, a barque called the "Atlantic" 332 tons, built by William Downing.

On Monday last May the dwelling house of the Rev. J. Sinclair Argyle point, West Cape was destroyed by fire, his books, clothes and the clothes of all the family being destroyed.

The body of Mr. Chapman who was lost from the Bay Verte packet last fall was found on the shore at Pictou point on the 7th inst.

Daniel O'Connell is dead having passed away at Genoa on the 17th May. A letter from Dr. Milby, his spiritual adviser, says O'Connell's heart was to be embalmed, placed in a silver urn and transported to Rome.

The "European Times" thus refers to his probable successor: "The question is who will succeed him and upon whose shoulders shall fall the mantle of the deceased prophet."

REV. JAMES CRISP TO REST TWO MONTHS

ST. JOHN, June 24--Rev. James Crisp will preach his farewell sermon as pastor of Zion Methodist church on Sunday, July 3, at the evening service, but will not assume his new charge at Dorchester for two months, having been granted leave of absence for that time by the congregation there.

Rev. William Lawson, his successor in Zion, now in Hillsboro, will be in St. John, during the week following July 3, but the date of his arrival here is not definitely known.

Rev. Mr. Crisp, who has spent the full four years allowed by the church as pastor of Zion church, regrets leaving, but is delighted with his new appointment and to a reporter yesterday said that he much appreciated the kindness of the governing body of the Dorchester church in granting him the two months leave of absence. He will arrange to send a student to supply.

Rev. Mr. Lawson will, it is understood, attend the general Methodist conference in Vancouver during the latter part of August. A united request of the N. B. and N. S. conference will be forwarded to the general conference asking that its next meeting be held either in this or the sister province. If New Brunswick is decided upon the session will be held in Sackville and if the lot falls to Nova Scotia, Halifax will be the place of meeting.

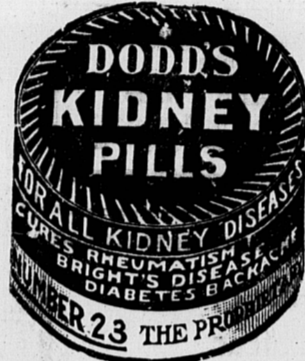

They were separated but at the supper table the fight was renewed. Hanson was pulled out of the dining room into the kitchen, and it is charged that he caught up a heavy butcher knife from the table and re-entered the dining room and drove the knife into Davis' breast, wounding him so severely that he died two days later.
