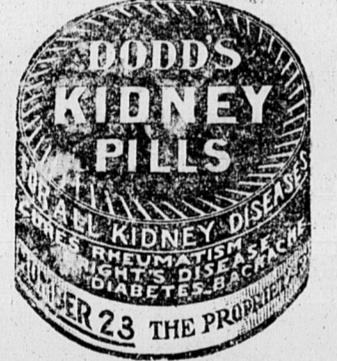

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—The initiative and referendum is up before the United States Supreme Court to be tested as to its constitutionality. The original case comes from Portland, Ore. Attorneys from San Francisco and Portland recently appeared before the highest tribunal in this country, in opposition to the initiative and referendum. It was contended by the attorneys opposing this method that they could not, with regard to the Federal constitution, be two legislative powers in a State, namely, the Legislature and the people. It was further contended that taxes imposed under the initiative and referendum were not by due process of law, and violated the equal protection of the law, so long as some persons were taxed under legislative enactments. During the arguments before the court in opposition to the initiative and referendum method the attorneys were closely questioned by Justice Lurton and Chief Justice White. The questions and demeanor of the judges were critical and indicated that their minds were not in harmony with the argument being adduced. A number of prominent attorneys appeared in defence of the initiative and referendum making splendid arguments for its retention as a legislative method in our scheme of government.

HARRY HYLAND GOING MONTREAL, November 14.—Harry Hyland has accepted an offer received some time ago from Frank Patrick, and will leave Montreal on the 25th of this month for the coast, where he will play hockey with what is now the out-law league. Harry left last week, and will in all likelihood be followed by Jimmy Gardner and Pud Glass. It is understood that Gardner had an interview yesterday with Mr. Lichtenstein, but that the latter could not offer him as good a price as stay as Patrick could go, so the chances are that the Wanderers will be without their great wing player this year.

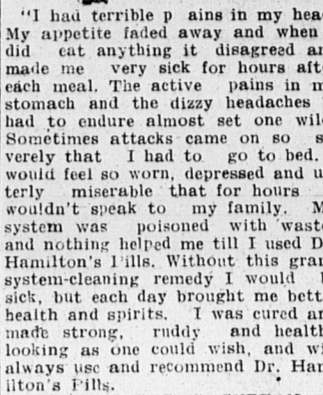

NEW LONDON, Nov. 12.—Word was received from Fort Terry, Plum Island, tonight, that about nine o'clock an unknown two-masted schooner sank in Plum Gut, and that probably all except the captain were drowned. An hour after the boat sank the captain floated ashore, tied to wreckage. Shortly afterward a man and a woman were seen in a dory attempting to make land, but 100 feet from shore a wave struck the boat overturning it. The man was washed ashore. There was no clew in his clothing to the name of the boat or his own name.

With over twelve hundred delegates and many others in attendance, the Hamilton district convention of the continent-wide Men's Missionary Movement opened in Centenary Church. The total registration was 1,154, of which 543 were city laymen, 384 outside laymen and 227 clergy.
