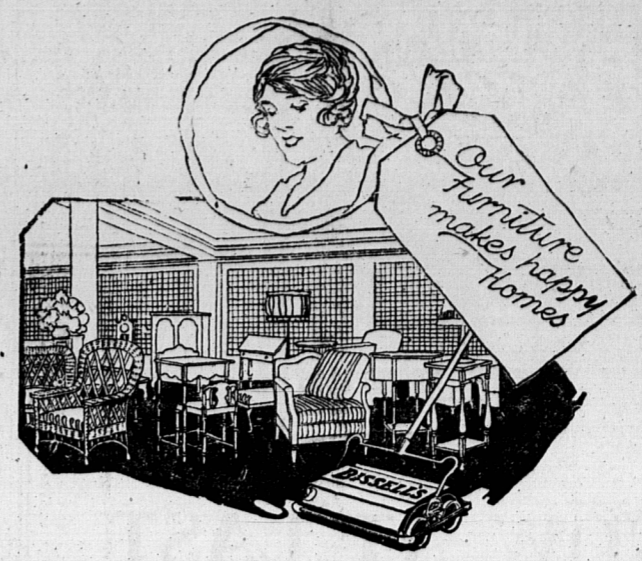

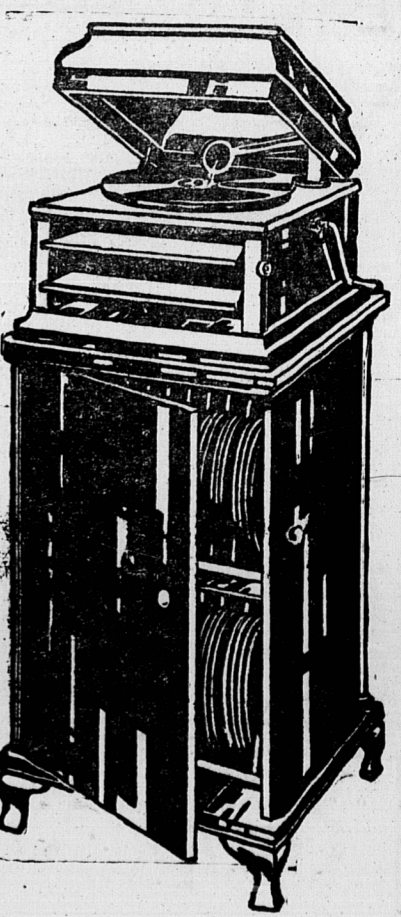

ever, that the depositories of wealth being in the ground, they are liable neither to loss nor destruction in any ordinary course of events. It is stated that the Sulphides of Antimony are indispensable to the Rubber Trade and that the largest near at hand markets are in the United States. These products of Antimony will accordingly be manufactured in Massachusetts, the ore going there free of duty while the products if manufactured here would be subject to an import duty. The additional capital now being raised, as appears from the announcement, for the purpose of duplicating production and establishing new manufacturers will be contributed largely by Canadian investors. It is only to be hoped that devel-

opment of natural productions for market in the United States such as this within Canada will be of such consequence as will materially assist in lessening the uneven balance of trade now existing between our two countries that are to our great disadvantage in dealings with our American neighbors. 6384.

For Gallantry in Action

The last issue of the Canada Gazette contains another long list of awards for war service with statements of the services for which the decorations were made. The list includes the following: Awarded bar to Military Cross: Lt. William Lawson Jenkins, M. C., 2nd Siege Battery, Can. Garr. Arty. On 28th September, 1918, he was sent forward from the battery position near Bois de Coquet to establish communication with the infantry front line system. Although being under heavy fire, he held on with great determination, and reached the headquarters of an infantry battalion. He then

made a full reconnaissance of our front line in full view of the enemy and obtained very valuable information. (M. C. gazetted 27th October, 1917.) Awarded Military Cross: Lt. Stanton Earl Prowse, 2nd Siege Bty., Can. Garr. Arty. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. During the afternoon of 28th September, 1918, he went forward from the battery position, near Bois de Coquet, to make a reconnaissance of wire which was holding up the advance of our infantry. This reconnaissance was made in full view of the enemy and under heavy fire. He returned to his battery with valuable information. At all times he has shown great zeal.
