LONDON, Feb. 5.—It appears that after her death Queen Victoria was arrayed in her royal robes, with all her foreign orders and decorations. Over these and across her breast was laid the ribbon and order of the garter. Her bridal veil was then placed over her head and face.

REMAINS BEING BROUGHT HOME.

The transport Grant, which recently arrives at San Francisco, brought the remains of 402 officers, soldiers and civilians employees who died in the Philippines, China and Hawaii. More than half of the number have been claimed by relatives for burial. The remainder will be held at the Quartermaster's Depot at San Francisco for a period of six weeks, and unless claimed in the meantime will be interred.

A PUZZLE LOTTERY.

TORONTO, Feb. 2.—Sydney Flynn, of the Toronto Publishing Co. was tried in the police court this morning for an alleged breach of the Lottery act. Flynn offered prizes to subscribers for the "Welcome Visitor" magazine who sent correct answers to word puzzles. Magistrate Denison gave it his opinion that the whole matter was one of chance so far as subscribers were concerned, and the evidence showed the scheme to be not only a lottery but a gigantic fraud.

Lieut. Governor McIntyre and Sir Lou's Davies Deliver Addresses.

MR. EDWARD BAYFIELD ELECTED PRESIDENT

The Personnel of the Official Staff—Important Resolutions Passed and God Save The King Closed the Session.

MORNING SESSION.

At the morning session Lieut. Governor McIntyre spoke briefly in favor of reserving lands for forests. Prof. Macoun then addressed the Association. At the Experimental Farm he said about 40 acres of land is devoted to fruits and vegetables. A great number of varieties of apples are grown. Experiments are constantly carried on as to the best means of exterminating of fungus, etc. When he visited the province two years ago he found apples that would compare with any other province.
