HERO'S HEROISM OF CAPT. OATES
(By British United Press)
LONDON, April 27. A story heard reached London from Capt. Oates, a very gallant "gentleman." Scott's companion in the tragic Antarctic expedition, was fully placed in position by Mr. Neil McDonald.

arrived at Capetown with eighty-two men and women from the French sealing factory ship Lozere, which was wrecked off the coast of Kerguelin, one of the loneliest and most desolate islands in the world. Oates, as every schoolboy knows, walked steadfastly to death in the snowdrift so that his companions should not be imperilled by their efforts to carry him to safety. His example was followed to the letter by a French ex-policeman, Lesques, Leccalondec, who also gave his life that his comrades might be saved. The Lozere had set out to return to France with \$150,000 cargo of oil, and with wives and children of the sealing station workers on board, when she struck an uncharted pinnacle of rock and broke her back. Captain Fortaine, the master, saw that the ship was doomed, and then as the water was rising in the stokehold, used the last ounce of power to send out a wireless message for help, which reached the

outer world weeks ago and gave the first tidings of disaster. All the ship's company reached the shore safely, but in a little while they were threatened with famine, and Leccalondec set out with two companions in a small boat in search of food. Their boat was wrecked in a blizzard, but they managed to scramble ashore at a point two days' march from the settlement. They had to pass over an unexplored, mountain range, and Leccalondec's strength failed. His companions carried him for some distance, but made little real progress, and at last he told them to go ahead and summon help. He declared that he could find his own way, and at last, most unwillingly, they consented to leave him. All the time that he was with the party he lay down and died. The other two reached the settlement a few days later, and a search party which was sent out found Leccalondec's frozen body.

The survivors endured endless hardships and had almost given up hope of rescue when the Kil-dalkey appeared. Two Frenchmen, with the wife and daughter of one of them, chose to remain on the island instead of returning in the Kil-dalkey, although they were faced with the prospect that they may be marooned for years, on Kerguelin, which lies only a few degrees above the northern limit of the Antarctic pack ice and is almost equal distant from South Africa and Australia, though far to the south of both of them.

VETERINARY'S SKILL
SIDNEY, N. S. W. April 27. An extraordinary story of "bush" veterinary skill comes from Goulburn, New South Wales. A dairy farmer noticed that one of his valuable cows was in agony and on making a close examination he found that an apple was smothered in the animal's throat. He placed a twelve pound hammer on one side of the cow's neck and he struck her on the opposite side with a six pound hammer. This had the effect of breaking the apple and the cow swallowed the pieces. Next day the cow was seen eating another apple, having apparently suffered no ill effects from her remarkable cure.
