The building formerly owned by Mr. John McKenzie, opposite Mr. R. T. Holman's store is being fitted up as an office for the Merchants Bank of P. E. I. The work is being done by Mechanics Manufacturing Co, and is expected to be ready for opening in a few weeks.

At an emergency meeting of the Council of the Summerside Board of Trade, held yesterday morning the advisability of making an effort to secure a more efficient telegraph service was discussed. The opinion recently expressed by Sir Louis H. Davies, in the House of Commons to the effect that the Anglo American Co. does not hold a monopoly of the Strait cable system, was quoted, and the secretary was instructed to communicate with the Charlottetown Board of Trade with a view to concerted action in the matter. A communication from Mr. R. McMillan, Charlottetown, in reference to the Summerside-Sydney route was read and is now under consideration.
