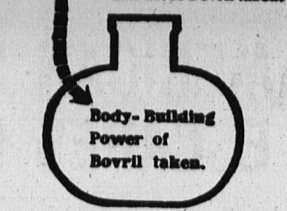

## Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole heir of a family of any state over eighteen years of age may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy is not permitted. A habitable house is required on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. ## RETURNED MEN PRAISE VETERANS

Gallant 22nd Battalion Still Holds its Place in Front Rank.

MONTRÉAL, Oct. 26.—Officers and men returned from the front are continually singing the praises of the 22nd French-Canadian Battalion. This famous unit, which had 17 out of 21 officers and more than half its men on the casualty list after Courcellette, is still doing remarkable work in the front line trenches.

The 22nd Battalion was raised at Montreal by Col. F. Gaudet, former superintendent of the Dominion arsenal at Quebec. Recruiting was started on Oct. 14th, 1914, and men of French Canadian birth or descent from all over Canada were accepted. After training in Canada, the battalion left for overseas on May 20, 1915. Its first big fight was at Zellebeke in Belgium from June 2 to June 14, 1916 when it greatly distinguished itself.

Three months later came the Twenty-Second's big opportunity at Courcellette. The aftermath found the troops badly mauled but famous for all time in Canadian and British military annals. 839-10-26M6L11.
