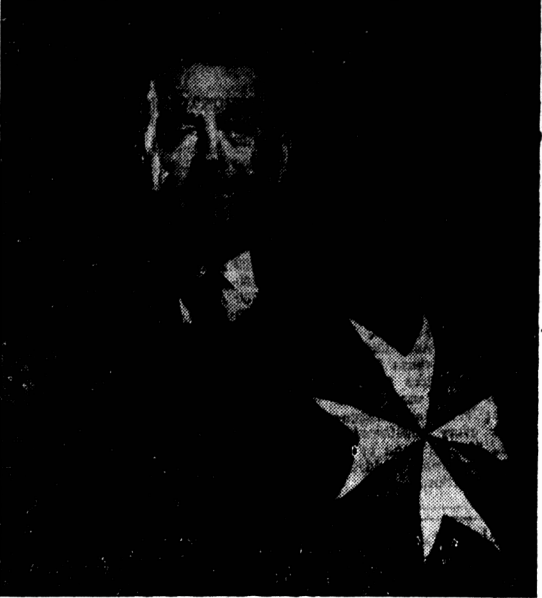

CANADIAN AID TO CHINA FUND

A national appeal is being made for \$2,500,000 to aid in the relief of the starving and distressed millions of people living in China.

After eight years of tragic war against Japan, during a large part of which China fought singlehanded, the country is war-weary and in urgent need of clothing, drugs, medical comforts, and food.

In addition to the charitable object of assisting the distressed Chinese, it must be remembered that a united and prosperous China can be a great force for world peace, whereas a dis-united and starving China can be a world menace.

Winston Churchill said: "We owe a deep debt of gratitude to our loyal ally, the unconquerable Chinese."

Canada has come through the War with comparatively small material damage, and China's need is our opportunity to make not only a real thank-offering, but an investment in the post-war world.

It is not possible to make a personal canvass of the people of Prince Edward Island, but those interested in the Campaign have requested me to urge that our people make their contributions to this Fund as generous as possible. The Campaign closes on February 10th, and contributions are now being received at any charitable bank in the Province.
