TO FORESTALL YANKEES.

Canadians Are Making Overland Trip to Labrador.
It now transpires that the Donaldson party which some weeks ago undertook the desperate trip to Labrador, it was then reported, Labrador, was forced to go overland to forestall two United States boats that are outfitting for the trip now in Boston and New York. Until this was discovered John Black and Eastern Townships associates were content to proceed by the placer ground by boat also, but when they learned that news of their movements had leaked out they determined to be first in the field at all hazards, hence their desperate trip. Three years ago the Roy brothers, French-Canadian of Montreal, northeastern shores of Hudson Bay. They at that time panned in pie plates in one afternoon twenty-three ounces of gold.
It is this placer field that they are going back to stake. One of the Roys went north with Billy Donaldson on the overland trip. The trip will go with the ship in the spring. The trip that Donaldson and his eight men are now engaged in is in the vicinity of 900 miles long. If they strike for the east coast of Hudson Bay the last point at which they rest is the Hudson Bay post of Prince Rupert, but that is hardly likely. They have learned of an old fur trail that led from a point east of Dane on the Tesnor to the north coast of Hudson Bay, and it is this that they will follow for 800 or 900 miles. They are well equipped for the task. They look out as they go along and feed to the survivors. They have altogether seven tons of provisions carefully selected by men who know to the last shoe-pole string just what they need. They have had with them three canoes. Donaldson was so delighted with the comfort of his men that he came back almost a hundred miles to get some supplies that they might want and that he found they had not.

It is curious in this connection to learn that the old stone built by Sir Martin Frobisher on Hall's Island, Frobisher Bay, have been rediscovered. They were never occupied, because the English miners that Sir Martin took there in 1578 refused to stay, and after he had loaded 150 tons of the ore into his ship he returned to England. Accounts returned to him as to whether the expedition was remunerative. At the point where they are going to operate, which may be north of Hudson Strait, the Donaldson party will remain until the ship being outfitted reaches them in the spring.
Some seeds have been taken north to plant in a prospective garden. The men in the enterprise have signed on for a year at a good wage per day and substantial interest in what they stake. It would be the height of madness for any single prospector to endeavor to trail the party in overland trail, as in many respects it would be much more arduous than the Klondyke, but there is little doubt that there will be several outfits breaking ice into the desired land in the spring. The fact that men who have made the find have gone back themselves and that such extensive and expensive preparations have been made to reach reputed placer fields by those who know the details of the find, lend credence to the story of the richness of the field.

Throne Sold For \$4.
Great bargains were secured by those who attended the auction sale of old furnishings at Rideau Hall, Ottawa, the official residence of the Governor-General of Canada, the other day.
The throne was one of the first things put up. Why it was sold is not known, for it was a rather handsome thing, and did not appear to be an article which would be required anywhere except at a viceregal establishment. That seemed to be the general impression, as it was knocked down to a peddler for \$4. A hand-carved black walnut sideboard, at least twenty-five feet long, which would make a load for a four-horse team, realized just seven dollars. It cost seven hundred, if not a cent more.
A dray load of visitors' books, in which the names of callers at the hall for years back are inscribed, and which contain the autographs of hundreds of more or less famous personages, went to a ragman at 25 cents each.

Cabinet Ministers' Age.
The new Canadian Cabinet is not, comparatively speaking, very much younger than was the Laurier Ministry when it took office in 1896. Of course, there were three aged members of the Laurier Ministry, Sir Oliver Mowat, Sir Henry Joly, and Hon. R. W. Scott, whose ages make the total heavier than it otherwise would be, but the average age of the Laurier Cabinet in 1896 compares not unfavorably with that of the Borden Cabinet of 1911.

Cigarettes Are Popular.
The quantity of cigarettes entered for consumption in Canada during the last fiscal year increased by nearly forty per cent, as compared with the preceding twelve months. The comparative figures were 48,770 pounds for 1910-11 and 35,049 pounds for 1909-10. Ontario leads all the other provinces by a very large margin, the amount credited to the province last year being 22,776 pounds, as compared with 16,553 pounds for the preceding year. Quebec comes next with 9,029 pounds and British Columbia third, with 7,186 pounds.
