**A QUIET GOING**—The first contingent  
of harvesters for the western  
grain fields passed through the city  
Saturday night, says the St. John  
Telegraph. For some days past men  
have been gathering at St. John with  
the intention of joining the harvest  
trains when they passed through. On  
Saturday about 500 men came from  
Digby on the Empress from several  
Nova Scotia points. It is estimated  
that the number of harvesters bow-  
ling westward will number about 1,800.  
The men caused no trouble at the de-  
pot or in the city, and the I. C. R. po-  
lice report that they were the quiet-  
est lot that have yet passed through.  
Mr. Robert New Brunswick  
points, as well as Nova Scotia and  
Prince Edward Island, made up the  
eastern contribution to the western  
fields. Under ordinary conditions cut-  
ting in the west would start about the  
middle of August and would be in full  
swing by the last of the month. There  
is a great demand in the west this  
year for harvest help on account of so  
many from that part of the country  
being at the war. Last year there was  
also a scarcity, and the crop was a  
particularly heavy one. It was re-  
marked that few of the fair sex were  
at the station to bid the boys good-by,  
as compared with former years, when  
the station was thronged. Evidently  
the young ladies are reserving their  
farewells for the lads in khaki who  
depart in the other direction to fight  
in the trenches.

ing Captain's course; also Lieut.  
Stevenson of Charlottetown, Lieut.  
C. A. Simpson, son of Canon Simp-  
son, is attached to the paymaster's  
staff. There are eight men in the  
Field Post Office at Aldershot all  
of these is Mr. Thomas Burnett late  
of the Post Office Department Char-  
lottetown.

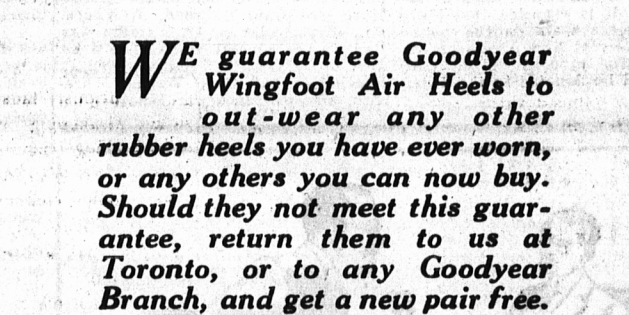
