THE PATRIOT'S LACK OF CONVICTIONS

Sir,—The Patriot has the means to insinuate that the Senators who lately advocated a reduction in the customs and excise duties, and a consequent reduction in the price of liquors were hired by the Liquor interests. And on the same page it bewails the excessive political and personal partisanship of the Island newspapers, but hypocritically declares that it is not a sinner in these respects. I mistake not, a reduction in the price of liquors was one of the planks in the Liberal platform at the last election, and the Patriot commended it; but it is always thus with the Patriot, condemning to-day what it praised yesterday, or vice versa. It has no principles and follows no settled line of policy on any public question, and it is doubtful whether it has any convictions even on moral questions. There is no doubt whatever but a considerable reduction in the Customs and Excise duties would put the smuggler and the illicit distiller out of business, but it seems that this is not what the Patriot and some of these who sacrifice for it want. The legal defence of the smugglers and the illicit distillers may bring considerable revenue to some who are close to the Patriot; therefore nothing must be done to interfere with the business of this gentry.
