BATHING ARRANGEMENTS.

In another column of this issue appears Mr. Louison's letter describing the public baths of Montreal, which letter affords useful and in piring information for those who desire to see like facilities provided here. The letter also places in bold relief the earnest desire of the writer and the young men of our city generally to bring about a much needed improvement. These efforts we think ought to be heartily seconded by men of older years, our City Council and those engaged in the professional and business life of the community. Those who advocate improvements and progressive measures ought to be encouraged by support, rather than discouraged by public apathy and indifference, as is too often the case. In this instance the Y. M. C. A. Directors have proved their earnestness by a generous subscription, which certainly ought to provoke some response from other members of the community.

These facts are apparent: A public bath is greatly needed in Charlottetown. The want of it is a public drawback. Hundreds of tourists who come hither and make but a brief stay, would remain in the city during the summer months if they could obtain the bathing privileges to which they are accustomed at home. Here are the best hotels the Island affords, while our beautiful Park and Gardens afford attractions not excelled or equalled at the seaside resorts. It is a common remark of tourists that Charlottetown is pretty enough and restful enough for them, if only there were a chance to take a dip in the salt water. On every side town and country are blended. We want the baths also for the comfort and health of our own people, and to add to the attractiveness of our city. The experience of other cities tells how greatly their baths are enjoyed and how largely they are patronised. Best of all there is no financial risk involved in the enterprise. It is evident from what is seen elsewhere that a public bath, properly constructed and equipped, would easily be self-supporting.

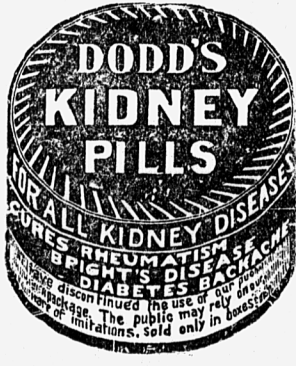

Young men must needs have a fair share of pastime, and it is as true now as it ever was that "the glory of young men is their strength." Encouragement given to manly and healthgiving sport is one of the most effective means of preventing a resort to amusements that are vicious and debasing. For this reason, and to keep alive worthy national memories and traditions, we are glad to see these annual competitions perpetuated in our midst. Indeed, in a community so largely of Scottish descent as ours is we should think it a mark of decadence were the love of these robust and manly games and sports to die out in our midst. We trust that many will show their appreciation by attending the gathering.

The town of Medicine Hat has fifty-six street lamps, and they run day and night at a loss of four cents per lamp—\$2.24 for the twenty-four hours. The light is supplied by natural gas and it is found cheaper to let the lamps burn than to turn them out in the morning and light them at night.

OWNS 5 BATHS

Which Pay Well--W S Louison Tells About Them For our Readers.

DEAR SIR,—As I promised, I have been looking into the swimming bath question today and report what news I have to hand.

There are five public baths in Montreal, built and supported by the city. I attended one of these called the St. Louis Bath, costing about seven thousand dollars and it was a sight to see. At about 200 men and boys were bathing at the time in a bath 90 by 35 feet. The average attendance at this bath is about 1,000 per day. Five cents is charged for a towel and bathing trunks. Ten cents is charged for a locker. In the hot weather about \$70 is realized from these sources per week. The man in charge gets \$2 per day, and no accidents have happened in the five years this bath has been running. The bath is made of concrete, and is three feet deep at one end, and running down to eight feet at the deeper part. Running water all the time.

The Laurentian Baths, of which I send you a folder is a four story building of brick. On an average 300 attend per day, winter and summer. Boys 15 cents; men 25 cents. Trunks and towel as well as locker supplied. This bath has been running 14 years. The dimensions are 80x34 feet. Swimming is taught for \$5. This bath is run by private individuals and pays well.

The Montreal Amateur Athletic Association have a beautiful bath for their members as have also the Y. M. C. A. Then there is the Turkish Bath, Montmarque street, and the Montreal Swimming Bath at St. Helen's Island about a mile from the City in the river. I send photograph taken at this favorite swimming bath.

So you see that Montreal is well supplied with baths and I sincerely trust Charlottetown will at least have one in the near future.

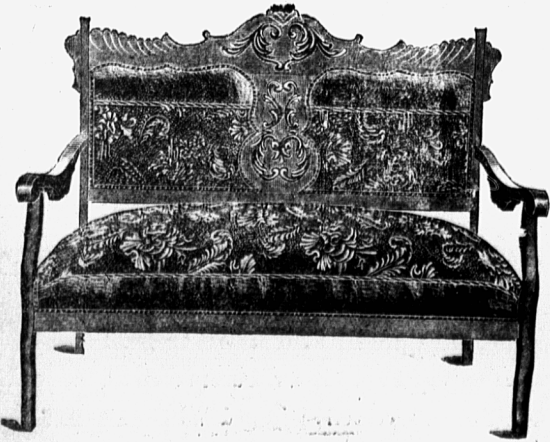
