New York Stocks Lose Slightly

BY FREDERICK GARDNER Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, July 11 (AP)—The stock market underwent a further correction of its June upswing today by retreating fractions to around 2 points generally. There were a few wider losses among more volatile issues. Transfers totalled 1,087,630 shares, the smallest turnover for a full session since the forward drive got under way June 20. It compared with 1,566,877 shares last Friday. The Associated Press average of 60 issues was off 6 of a point at 47. Canadian issues were mixed. International Nickel lost 3-8 points to 48 1/8 while Waskesy, Ford, Imperial Oil, and Massey-Ford eased fractions. Slightly improved were Dome, Lake Shore, McIntyre and Hollinger. Aircrafts were exceptions to the sliding industrial groups, although most of these ended considerably under their best for the day and one or two were even down slightly. Steels seemingly ignored a rebound in the current week's mill operating rate. U. S. steel was down 2 1/2 to 55 5/8 and Bethlehem yielded 2 1/4 at 57. Youngstown lost at 37 and National Steel tumbled 4 at 56 1/4. Rail shares were a bit depressed. Motors were fairly well supported for a time as manufacturers were slightly upward put estimates. They skidded eventually.

Gilt edged issues and mines steadied. Mixing sentiment resulted from last week's mild reaction in Wall Street.

Light Selling Depresses Market

MONTREAL, July 11 (CP)—Light selling depressed stock market prices today in one of the quietest sessions for some time. Metals were most sensational to the general ease. Noranda dropped two points, Nickel one and Smelters 3-4. Price dropped 1-2 and St. Lawrence Corporation 1-4. In the rails, Canadian Car preferred slipped 3-4, the Common 1-8 and C. P. 1-4. Shawinigan and Brazil sank about 1-2 each in the utilities, while Montreal Power, although closing unchanged, was 1-2 until a few Down 1-4 in the constructions were Cement and United Steel. Gypsum was a shade firmer. Lessees of small fractions included General Steel Wares and Dominion Steel and Alcoa "B". Imperial Oil, International Pete and National Breweries reacted to the decline gaining small fractions.

Livestock

MONTREAL, July 11 (CP)—Receipts on Montreal market Cattle 1,728; calves 1,229; hogs 1,317; sheep and lambs 1,017. Comments: Cattle were slow to start and there were not enough dealers to form a basis for quotations. Calves were a shade easier. Good veals sold at \$7. Grassers made from \$4 to \$25. Drinkers and high veals sold around \$3 and medium veals from \$5.50 to \$6.50. Lambs were 50 cents or more lower. Good lambs sold at \$10 to \$10.50 with a few cuts out at \$8 to \$9.50 and with several mixed lots at \$10. Sheep were \$2 to \$3.50, odd top \$4. Hogs were unchanged at \$12 for \$12.25. Selects drew \$1 per hog premium with the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were from \$7.50 to \$8.50.

Currencies

MONTREAL, July 11 (CP)—The Pound Sterling declined 7-8 of a cent at 96 1/8 on Montreal foreign exchanges today, while the French franc held about even at 2.78 1/16 cents. The United dollar remained unchanged at 3-4 per cent premium.
