MC GILL SCHOLARSHIPS.—Announcement of an exhibition of the value of \$50 to be awarded annually to the candidate from the Ottawa Valley who obtains the third highest percentage at the June matriculation examination and who attends McGill University during the next session, was made recently by Dr. J. A. Nicholson, Registrar of the University. This exhibition was presented through the Ottawa Valley Graduates' Society by Dr. H. Ami, and is to be known as the Dr. H. Ami Exhibition. A further announcement of the conditions governing the award of the Edith Silver Memorial Scholarship which was offered last June, but which has not yet been awarded, was made by Dr. Nicholson. This is an annual scholarship of the value of \$100 and is given by a group of Jewish women students at McGill in memory of Edith Silver, who obtained her Master's degree in Arts at McGill in 1924. This scholarship will be awarded on the results of the June University matriculation examination or the High School leaving examination of the Province of Quebec covering the subjects for entrance to the McGill Faculty of Arts. It will be open to women students who obtain over 70 per cent of the total marks possible and will be awarded to the applicant who stands highest in this division and who at the same time is in need of assistance to undertake them.
