The matter brought to notice by Judge Fitzgerald in regard to public safety on our ferries are important, and to a large extent apply to all vessels carrying passengers to and from our ports. In the General Slocum disaster it was found that life boats were fastened down with wire and could not be cut loose. Oars were not available in some cases. Of life preservers there were enough, but they were not easily accessible. When got the fastenings were found to be rotted with age. Worse still, many of them would not float when saturated with water and were worse than useless. Fire hose often takes damage in various ways and then fails in an emergency. Fire drill and boat launching should be frequently practised on all passenger boats, and life preservers should be tested for strength and buoyancy, not merely counted at the inspection.

Mr. Tiffin, the General Traffic Manager of the Intercolonial Railway paid The Guardian a pleasant call yesterday afternoon. He finds the Island Railway in good shape, and says that since 12th June the through express from Boston to Point du Chene gives as good cars as are in use on any part of the road. He admits that before that date the cars between Stellarton and Picou and between Painsce and Point du Chene were not what could be desired, but they were the best the road could afford for branch lines with limited traffic when the rolling stock was taxed to the utmost. Traffic receipts on the I. C. R. are in excess of previous years. The Ocean Limited, the new flying train, will begin service on July 3rd. It will leave Halifax at 8.15 a. m., reach Montreal at the same hour the following morning, and with its western connections will place passengers in Toronto, Detroit or Buffalo four hours ahead of any other route.

FOR PUBLIC SAFETY.

Sir,—I write not to find fault, but solely to give a timely warning to those in authority over our two ferry steamers.

In reading an account of that awful catastrophe on board the General Slocum I noticed the following passage:

"It is alleged that the life preservers were too securely fastened to their hold-ings to be available, and stories are told of frantic efforts to cut them loose, but even if they could have been torn down they were too high up for the children to reach them."

Hundreds of women and children travel in our ferry steamers, especially in the one running to Rocky Point. On whom rests the responsibility of seeing that in case of accident these helpless ones are within easy and sure reach of a life preserver? I ask also how many are there of them on each boat? And in what condition are the life boats? And are there any "life rafts," so infinitely more dependable and useful?

Is it not better to call attention to this matter now and have things put right than to indulge in useless recriminations when disaster has overtaken us unprepared for it?
