THE BY-ELECTIONS.

The way of the people in elections is sometimes strange as the way of a serpent on a rock, or of a ship in the sea, which puzzled a wise man of old. For instance, there is St. John, which a few years ago gave a sweeping Conservative majority and now within a few weeks returned the Liberal Minister of Public Works by acclamation. And on the other side, there is London, Ontario, the proud seat of the last previous Minister of Public Works, which has now returned an Opposition candidate by a thousand majority.

After the bye-election in St. John the Liberal press and party took comfort in the thought that "all the county is in sympathy and accord with Laurier," ascension of the party organs put it. And now we shall have the Conservative organs equally sure that the result in London sounds the death knell of the Government. In our humble judgment the results in both Saint John and London are exceptional, and may fairly be taken to balance each other. Saint John wanted a strong representative at Ottawa, for the benefit of St. John, and found her man in Dr. Pugsley. Party had but little to do with the result there. London was disgusted with the past record of political corruption and debauchery there. This was so apparent that the Liberal party abandoned the seat, just as the Conservatives in St. John for an entirely different reason abandoned the seat there.

There is still a very large Conservative electorate in Saint John and a very large Liberal electorate in London, and these elements will be apparent at the general election when it comes. The respective merits of Laurier and Borden, or of the Liberal and Conservative parties and policies had little to do with the by-election in the two cities. We are therefore disposed to offset one against the other, and conclude that the country has so far given no clear indication of any coming change in its support. The Government is yet very strongly entrenched, especially in Quebec and Nova Scotia. There are some indications, perhaps, that Quebec is not quite so solidly Liberal as it was, and this may mean much, or it may mean little. The whole country has not yet made up its mind for a change, certainly not in any such way as in 1873, in 1878, or even as in the rather hesitant fashion of 1896.

As to London, it is claimed by some of the Liberal organs that the sole reason for not contesting the seat at present was the desire to await Mr. Hyman's return. Most persons at this distance regard it as very improbable that Mr. Hyman will ever again be a candidate in London.

The British press is energetically discussing Asiatic immigration to Canada and the attitude of the Dominion thereto. The treatment of the Hindus, who are fellow subjects, is strongly censured, and the alleged danger from an influx of Japanese is treated very lightly. The British editors think Canada has become "jingoistic."

Leader Borden in a speech delivered at Winnipeg took up Hon. Dr. Pugsley's charges and calls for a Royal Commission with full powers to investigate to the bottom all the facts pertaining to the Liberal and Conservative campaign funds of 1904. This seems a fair proposal. Better still, Mr. Borden offers to go before such a Commission and tell all he knows.
