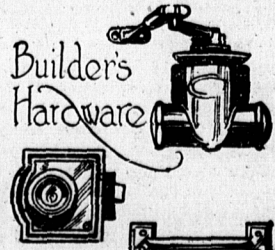

CHARLOTTE GORDON IS DEAD

CALGARY, Alta., Nov. 16.—(By The Canadian Press)—Mrs. Charlotte Isabel Gordon, known throughout Canada by her pen-name "Charlotte Gordon," is dead after an illness of one month.

Mrs. Gordon, who was the wife of Dr. A. J. Gordon, was one of Calgary's best-known women writers, for besides the fame which came from the publication last year of her novel, "Red Gold," she was equally noted for her many magazine and newspaper feature articles. Last July she represented the Alberta branch of the Canadian Author's Association at the annual convention of that organization in Fredericton, N. B. She was also a member of the Canadian Women's Press Club.

Deceased was the only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Toombs, who now reside at Vancouver, and went to school at Stonewall, Manitoba, where her father was the editor of the newspaper. She married Mr. Gordon when he was living at Carman, Manitoba, and soon afterwards they moved to Vancouver, later coming to Calgary to reside in 1917.

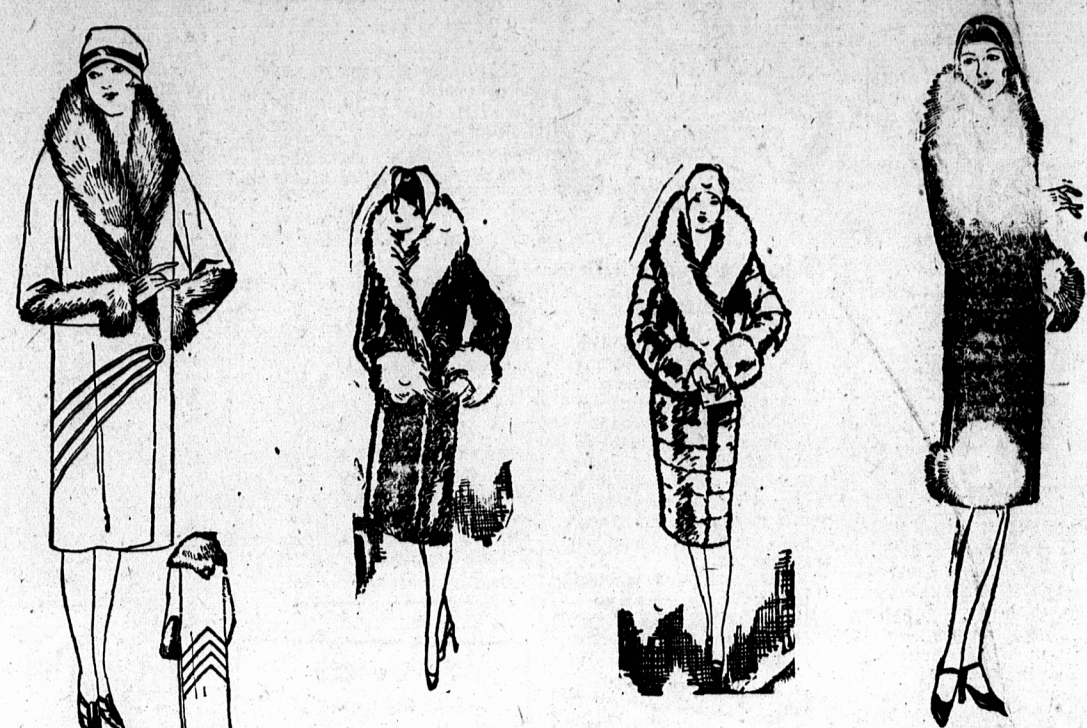
