**SONS OF ENGLAND TRIBUTE TO CAPTAIN SCOTT.**

At a recent meeting of the Sons of England, of Charlottetown the following tribute to Captain Scott and his comrades who perished in the South Polar Regions was passed:—

In view of the recent calamity which has befallen the nation in the death of Capt. Scott and his party of Antarctic explorers, we, the Officers and Members of the Sons of England Benefit Society in Charlottetown, P. E. I., assembled would wish to place on record our feelings of deep sorrow.

While we mourn the loss of one of England's best and bravest, yet in his determination, endurance, bravery, and death, Capt. Scott has nobly reminded us that British heroism is not a thing of by-gone days. He would not yield till he had accomplished his purpose. His was no competitive race for Antarctic honors, and when the contents of the book which piloted his dying head are made known we believe the world will be richer in scientific knowledge, the result of the doings of a modern British hero. He worked, he struggled, he suffered, as one with a mighty purpose. He accomplished his task—he left the world better than he found it. He shouldered a burden and carried it through sun and thunder, until summoned by the inevitable to quit his labours, he calmly and bravely surrendered his noble life, breathing out his last thoughts in unselfish remembrance of others.

It is difficult to imagine a more sublime act than that of Capt. Scott who staggered out into the Antarctic blizzard to die alone. In his hopeless state with frozen limbs and blinded eyes he went out from their tent never to return, and thus relieved his comrades from the responsibility of care and attention and left them to bear no burdens but their own. Thus far away from the popular gaze in the white light of the frozen zone, of his own free will, without show or argument he thrilled the world with what Capt. Scott, in the shadow of his own death, called "The act of a brave man and an English gentleman."

We commend the sorrowing widow and friends to God and the great heart of the British nation. Noble lives are again sacrificed to the advancement and welfare of the world, and as we pause to mark the spot where those British heroes fell we can say that,—

"Here we have nobleness enough to thrill—  
Those strong men bowing to their Master's will—  
Unselfish, patient, and with honest high showing the world how Englishmen can die."
