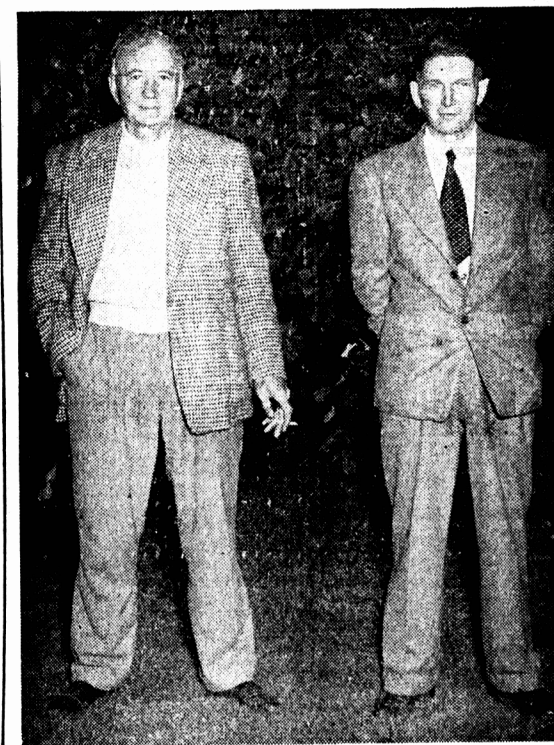

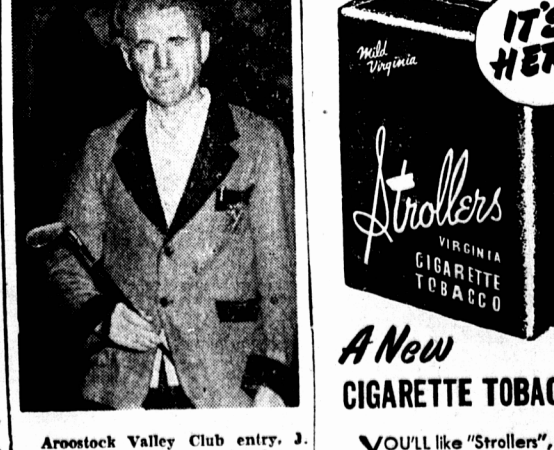
Red Sox In Win Over Vics
