The character of Prince Edward Island autumn weather may be judged from the fact that several ladies enjoyed a swim last Saturday, October 6th, at Summerside's popular bathing resort, Crescent Beach, and they say they are going in again this week.

A RESOLUTION adopted by the Summerside Presbyterian congregation, expressing their gratitude to N. Bruce McKelvie for his handsome gift of a pipe organ, has been engrossed by Lawrence W. Watson, Charlottetown, and was exhibited in Summerside Saturday night and Sunday morning. The universal verdict was that Mr. Watson is an artist of a very high order and that the record given to the congregation, was in both word and workmanship, in keeping with the magnificent gift.

J. H. Costain, the energetic telephone manager for Prince County, deserves much credit for the expeditious manner in which he adjusted the telephone system at Summerside, after the havoc wrought by Sunday's gale. On Sunday evening there were 55 wires down, and not one telephone connected with the central. Last night all were connected and in good condition. The Kensington line to Charlottetown is working and the Southern line is expected to be in operation this morning.

WHAT might have resulted in a serious fire, occurred on Railway wharf, Summerside, Sunday morning during the gale. A fire was discovered near the coal shed by John McDonald, second officer of the Empress, just as it was beginning to assume alarming proportions. Hastily summoning a number of the Empress crew, they went to work with buckets and soon had it under control. Had it not been discovered in time, it might, with the gale blowing, have endangered the town. The fire resulted, it is supposed by ashes from the engine.

The gale of Saturday night and Sunday played havoc with the telephone system in Summerside and strewn the streets with tangled wires and the branches of ornamental trees. One of the handsome birches on the lawn of Allan Parsons was also blown down. The schooner, Telephone, Capt. Allan Grady, called into Summerside harbor about 9 o'clock Sunday morning with her sails badly torn.

The schooner, J. B. Martin, which, as previously reported, was sold at Egmont Bay Thursday, was fortunately floated Saturday night just before the gale, came on. An hour or so later in floating her, would have meant her total destruction with possibly the lives of the crew, as she lay in an exposed position and could not possibly have withstood the gale. Mr. Stewart, her new owner, is to be congratulated on his good luck in getting her off just when he did. The saving of this vessel is due to the strenuous efforts of Capt. John L. Read and his crew, notably, Capt. Basil Kelly, Antoine Arsenault, Alex. Gallant (Shediac) and others who, at the risk of their lives, worked night and day from Thursday until they moored her safely in Summerside harbor at midnight Saturday. Certainly strenuous effort has seldom been so signally rewarded. The schooner Lots, Capt. Lawrence, owned by Jos. Read & Co. had a close call in a run from Chatham. The storm carried her southward of Summerside harbor and the seas soon began to break over her. Her boats davits were broken, one of the boats carried overboard but saved and towed upside down into port. The department was obliged to break the bulwarks to prevent her filling through the cabins. No sail could withstand the fury of the sea and she came into port under bare poles, hundreds of citizens watching her as she struggled to weather the light which was almost to windward. The gale blew with hurricane force all day Sunday with the barometer lower than has been known in years.

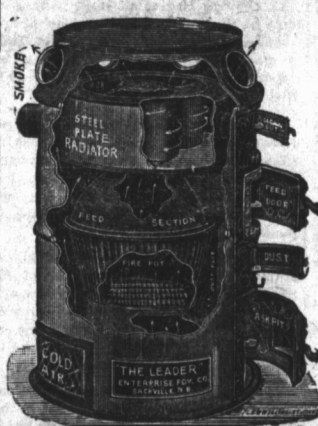
