THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY.

At various times during the few years past correspondence has passed between Charlottetown, St. John and Halifax with regard to the need of an active Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to animals in this Province. Complaints have from time to time been made of specific instances in which cruelty was charged. Just now we have been shown the copy of a letter from Mr. S. Wetmore Merritt, Secretary of the S. P. C. T. A. of New Brunswick and addressed to Mr. H. B. Stairs, of Halifax, who is the Secretary of the same Society there.

In this letter Mr. Merritt tells that it has been reported to him by a commercial traveller that in November last about 100 sheep were shipped by steamer from Charlottetown to Sydney, the sheep being placed on the main deck, in a very exposed situation and that several of the sheep perished. Mr. Merritt adds that it is too bad there is not a society in Prince Edward Island to deal with these matters, as they are beyond the jurisdiction of the societies on the mainland. Both the Secretaries for New Brunswick and Nova Scotia show a desire to co-operate in any work for the prevention of cruelty to animals here. THE GUARDIAN is of opinion that such a society should be in working in this Province and that steps should be taken for its formation, or to revive the dormant society devoted to this object which report says at one time existed here.

There is a great Christian Science lawsuit now pending in Boston in which Mrs. Josephine Curtis Woodbury is the plaintiff and Mrs. Eddy defendant. Mrs. Woodbury some years ago was only second to Mrs. Eddy in the ranks of the Christian Scientists, but she began to doubt and afterward seceded. The libel suit grows out of Mrs. Eddy having compared Mrs. Woodbury to a certain woman mentioned unfavorably in the seventeenth chapter of the Book of Revelation. The trial is expected to last six weeks. The plaintiff's statements already filed contain 15,000 words, a fair sized book. She will be supported by over eighty witnesses. "Mother" Eddy will also be supported by many witnesses. To-day the Christian Scientists in the United States are said to number a million, all but 9,000 having been brought into the fold since 1890.

The census returns of the Australian colonies now embodied in the Commonwealth have just been completed and prove a little disappointing. Including New Zealand, which is not in the union, the total population is about four and a half millions. This shows an increase in ten years of less than 11 per cent, which would not equal the natural excess of births over deaths. We have been accustomed to think of Australia as a land from which there was no exodus, but as immigration has supplied many thousands the only conclusion that can be reached from the census figures is that many thousands must also have left the country. The free trade state of New South Wales made a gain during the ten years of about 12 per cent. Victoria where high protection prevailed showed an actual decline in population outside of the city of Melbourne. No doubt the federal union under the moderate tariff now to be looked for will give a new impetus to Australian growth and development.

THE SAFETY OF TRAVEL.

Statistics given out by a Canadian Pacific official prove that a person is as safe in a passenger coach as at his own fireside. Last year the Canadian railroads carried 22,000,000 passengers, and only seven fatal accidents occurred. Speed has not been sacrificed to obtain this result, and the credit is due to the great care that has been taken in the working out of all the details of the service.—Montreal Gazette.

200,000 JEWS BAPTIZED.

BOSTON, Mass., May 31.—The Rev. Louis E. Meyer, of Hopkinton, Iowa, caused a sensation in the Hebrew Messianic conference here to-day by declaring that 201,540 Hebrew had been baptized during the nineteenth century. He said 2,240 baptisms were in Evangelical churches 57,300 in Roman Catholic churches, and 75,500 in Greek Catholic churches.

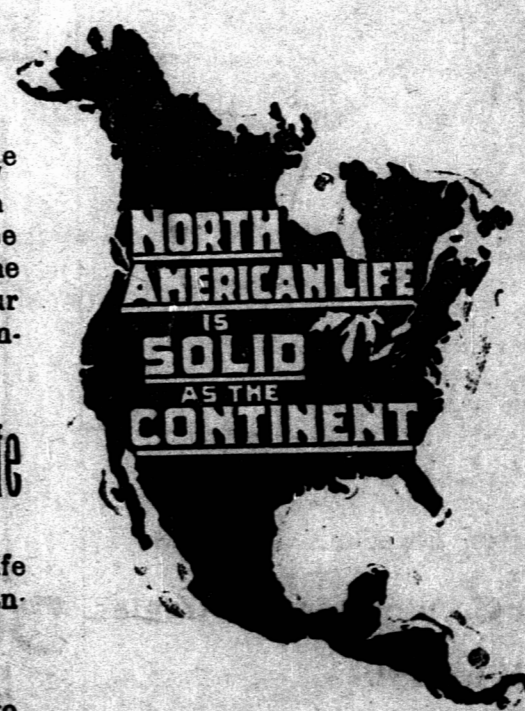
