**THE SPECIAL VOTES ELECT
HON. J. H. CUMMISKEY BUT
DEFEAT PREMIER PETERS**

The special votes were opened by the Sheriff of the three Counties yesterday and transmitted to the different Counties to which they belonged.

There was considerable excitement over the result in the city and the votes cast for Hon. Mr. Peters and H. D. McEwen in St. Peter's and Hon. J. H. Cummiskey and Peter McCourt in Fort Augustus were especially eagerly counted, for upon them depended the election or defeat of two members of the Government.

For a greater part of the time the votes were in favor of Mr. McCourt, who had also led in the election day voting but in the opening of the last few sealed envelopes a majority was in favor of Hon. Mr. Cummiskey and the full unofficial returns show that he has a majority over his opponent of one.

Hon. Mr. Peters had a majority of six on election day but this was gradually cut down, finally altogether disappearing, and leaving him in a minority of one. The sessions of the returning officers' courts were concluded in King's and Queen's about one o'clock but in Prince County the work of assorting was not finished till the afternoon. The Piquit special votes did not reach Charlottetown till five o'clock last evening and another session was held to count these. Previous to this Hon. Mr. Peters had a majority of one but this fell to three votes against him to one for, thus placing him in a minority of one.

In other close seats F. L. Hazard's majority over Henry Wood is increased from six to ten and that of John Kichham over Thomas Kichham from four to six.

In Brackley Point poll Hon. J. H. Cummiskey has 42 votes instead of 41 as first published.

J. A. Mathieson's majority was 107 on election day and to this is added a majority of twenty in special votes yesterday.

The majority of J. F. H. Arsenault is 24 instead of 31 as at first and of Geo. Godkin 91 instead of 41.

Those interested will now look forward with anxiety to Declaration Day, next Wednesday, when the poll books will be officially added again and special votes counted by the Returning Officers of the different counties.

The following are the only correct figures yet published. They were secured by Guardian representatives in each county.

In each district the opposing Assemblymen are given first, the opposite Councilmen following and for each candidate his total vote on election day, his special votes, and his grand total.
