Among the passengers to Summerside by the Empress last evening were Thomas and Mrs. Howatt, returning from the United States where they spent the winter with their daughter and Dr. Darrah, Kensington, returning from a business trip to the mainland.

The steamer Bonavista, which was due in Summerside about 6 p. m. last evening arrived at the mouth of the harbor about dark, where she anchored for the night and on arriving this a. m., will load for Newfoundland, her cargo from Summerside consisting of about fifty tons of hay, five hundred bags of oats and about two hundred bags of potatoes.

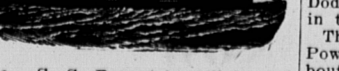
