LESSON VI. MAY 7.

UZZIAH, KING OF JUDAH, HUMBLED.

2 Shron. 26: 8-21.

GOLDEN TEXT.

"Pride goeth before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall."—Prov. 16: 18.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

The study of humiliation of Uzziah should not issue in the discount of progressive ideas or right ambitions. While the king sought the Lord his capacity for prosperity was within safe limitations. When he failed to remember that he was helped marvelously, and when his gifts began to bulk larger than the Giver, sin lay crouching at his door.

What fault can there be attached to a love of husbandry? None. What can there be wrong in an appreciation of the inventions of cunning men? None. What just charge of sinful purpose or criminal intent can be laid against statesmanlike abilities or splendid capacity for generalship? None. The reason of Uzziah's humiliation lay elsewhere.

It was the entrance of pride into the heart. It was the withdrawal of the bounds of ambition which subjected it to God's leadership until, like waters that overflow, it overran and smothered humility, and reverence, and consecration.

Pride is a subtle agent of the devil, which in the very elation it produces is preparing a way to destruction. Self-satisfaction, self-admiration, is that foothold thing which despises the ladder by which the ascent has been made, but, with the ladder removed, leaps to destruction. Some one says: "Pride, like an expert wrestler, usually gives a man a lift before he gives him a throw."

Possibly prosperity is the severest test that may be applied to character. The teaching of Jesus concerning the difficulties of riches in their relation to the kingdom of heaven would seem to indicate that it is. At the same time, it is a mistake to suppose that inordinate pride is not often the sin and the destruction likewise of those who all their lives are acquainted with poverty. Simplicity of circumstances must not be confounded with simplicity of heart.

What reason had Uzziah to let his heart be lifted over the achievements which were peculiar to his reign? He had no better reason for it than those who profit by our mighty modern inventions. And surely they have none. Great are the wonders of steam and electric propulsion, mighty are the transformations of the cataract into light, and heat, and power-producing agencies; marvelous are the engineering feats in the bridge and tunnel building and of hideous sky-scraping architecture. The inventions of cunning men are still employed for the construction of more terrible machines of war, but the study of an anti-hill will laugh to scorn the best that man has made.

The lesson suggests a fine field for reflection upon the wide distinction, as well as the character of that distinction, between presumption and consecration, and also between the rights of those who are set apart for a task and those who wantonly take it up. No age dares to become so democratic as to forget that a worthy deed may be done in an unworthy way and be without honor from the Lord God.

The corrections of the Lord and the retributive nature of His displeasure are repeatedly taught in the Bible. But the history of a year which the newspaper has revealed, which is daily looked for at the door, will furnish teaching just as decisive that the way of the transgressor is hard.

## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

ANY person who is a single head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available land in any of the Northwest Territories or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made, by any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother, or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$200 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each six years from date of homestead entry and cultivate the land in each year.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may enter for a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$500 per acre.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.
