

DALHOUSIE COLLEGE NEWS

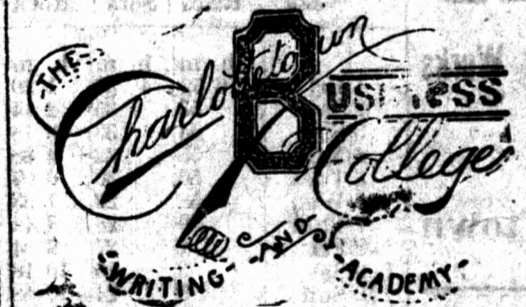
