Robert B. Mantell, the distinguished actor, has just concluded a successful week's engagement at the Princess Theatre, Montreal, in Shakespearean plays. Mr. Mantell is perhaps the most famous actor today playing the dramas of the great English writer. He has appeared in Charlottetown on several occasions.

Angus N. Darrach, New Haven, has received a telegram from Calgary, Alberta, announcing the death of his youngest son John, aged 21 years, of typhoid fever. His body is expected to arrive on Wednesday night accompanied by his sister and brother.

Charlottetown will, this evening, have the honor of welcoming one of the British Empire's greatest statesmen, Alfred Lord Milner, G.C.B., K.C.B., who is expected to arrive, accompanied by A. J. Glazebrook of Toronto. The distinguished visitor arrived at Rimouski last Thursday, and has since visited Truro and Sydney. He purposes visiting Halifax, Charlottetown and St. John. His program in Charlottetown will include a visit to the Exhibition and, it is understood, an effort will be made to have him deliver an address as he is a brilliant speaker as well as a distinguished author and journalist. Lord Milner will be remembered chiefly in his connection with the events leading up to and immediately following the Boer War. He was appointed High Commissioner of South Africa in 1897, and represented Great Britain at the conference in 1899 with President Kruger when an effort was made in vain to avert the storm then threatening. During the war he was the Empire's right hand man in South Africa and, at its close, in recognition of his valued services was created a baronet and, later, a viscount. He was governor of the new South Africa until 1906 when he was instrumental in securing representative government for the Transvaal. He is an ardent imperialist and an advocate of tariff reform with intercolonial preference.

SAVE YANKERS FROM MEXICANS.

DOUGLAS, ARIZ., Sept. 21.—Four Americans, who had been taken captive by Mexican insurgents, were rescued late yesterday after the rebel had been defeated in battle by a Federal force under Colonel Oregon, twenty-seven miles south of agua Prieta at San Juanin ranch.
Nine Federals were wounded and five insurgents were killed. Oregon's force, which consisted of 182 men, mostly friendly Yaqui Indians, surprised the rebels as they were eating, capturing a machine gun and eight prisoners. The rebels fled, pursued by the Federals.
News of the fight was telephoned here by the Americans who were liberated by the Federals. M. L. Polard, one of the Americans, sent word today he and his companions were en route here from El Tigre when captured.
