WEEKLY WIRELESS & ELECTRICITY LETTER

The Dietetic and Hygienic Gazette contains and interesting account of investigations into the effects of electricity upon the development of school children.

The walls and ceilings of a school-room were lined with wire through which high frequency currents were passed. The inmates of the room, thus in an electro-magnetic field like the iron core of an electro-magnetic.

Fifty normal children were placed in this room and fifty others of the same average age, size and mental and physical developments kept in adjoining room. The tests covered a period of six months during which time one group of children was under the influence of the electric currents. At the end of the period those children who had been subjected to the electricity showed an average growth of two inches, while those without electricity only grew one and one quarter inches.

The electrified children also showed considerable increase in weight and other forms of development in proper proportion to their weight.

They also showed an average proficiency of ninety-two per cent in their studies while 15 of them showed 100 per cent.

On the other hand not one of the unelectrified children reached 100 per cent and the average was only 75 per cent.

The electrical apparatus generated a small amount of ozone and there was a faint odor of it present in the room. It is held, however, that the presence of ozone would not account for the results observed.

A tall tree on a high bank of the Lewis River in Washington, has been leased to a telephone company for a period of fifteen years, the consideration being ten dollars. The span of the river at this point is considerable and the company entered into this peculiar contract because it felt that it would be cheaper to lease this tree than to put in a regular pole of sufficient height to keep the wires above navigation in the river.

In case the tree dies or is destroyed before the expiration of the lease, the company is given the right to erect a pole. It also reserves the right to put guy wires on the tree.

The maker of this peculiar lease is Mrs. Mary Bratton who leased the tree to the Etna Telephone Company.

Broken in two amidships the steamship Santa Rosa lies on the rocks near Santa Barbara, Cal., where it drifted to destruction on the night of July 7th last. The wreck is of direct interest to wireless enthusiasts, as it developed a new complication, and possibly a new danger, in the use of wireless telegraphy in the case of wrecks. The charge was made (and the subject is now being officially investigated) that the owners sent wireless messages to the Captain of the vessel after it had gone on the rocks, and that unnecessary delay in getting the passengers ashore was caused by conflicting orders.

Of course the danger of taking the ship out of the Captain's control, while in a perilous position might add greatly to the dangers of the sea, especially if the Captain was not resolute enough to assert himself in the face of orders from the home office. As it was, the vessel lay on the rocks twelve hours before the sea became so rough that it was deemed imperative to send a boat ashore with a life line. This boat was capsized and the crew of four men drowned. The passengers were all safely landed however, by means of the breeches buoy. It seems likely that laws will be passed forbidding such interference by wireless on the part of owners when a ship is in peril.

CHINA HONORS WASHINGTON.

NANKING, Feb. 22—Radicals among the Republicans today presented a petition to the National Assembly demanding that Yuan Shi Kai, who was elected President of the Chinese republic ten days ago, be impeached because of his refusal to come to Nanking, the recognized republican capital to take the oath of office. This proposition will be stoutly resisted by Dr. Sun Yat Sen, former provisional President, Dr. Wu Ting Fang and other prominent statesmen among the Republicans.

The Assembly chamber was today decorated with American flags in honor of George Washington's birthday anniversary, this being February 22 in China, as well as in the United States, not that the Western calendar has been officially adopted.

\$2,000,000 FIRE AT BALTIMORE.

BALTIMORE, Md., Feb. 22—Fire which did damage estimated at fully \$2,000,000 destroyed the warehouses of the Mount Clare shops of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad on Pratt Street here today. The buildings burned covered a full city block. The fire was caused by an explosion. The place was intricate. The warehouses were filled with supplies which were worth nearly \$1,000,000. At twelve o'clock the fire department announced that they had the fire practically under control.

The fire was fanned by a high wind and soon after the explosion, which was caused by spontaneous combustion of oil, the fire had spread to all the company's buildings in the shops and offices.

ROCKEFELLER DEATH REPORT CAUSES STIR.

NEW YORK, Feb. 22—Some excitement was caused in newspaper offices here today by a report that John D. Rockefeller was dead. The communications sent to Augusta, Pa., where the oil king is spending the winter, brought the immediate reply that he was "very much alive." A similar report was circulated just a year ago today.

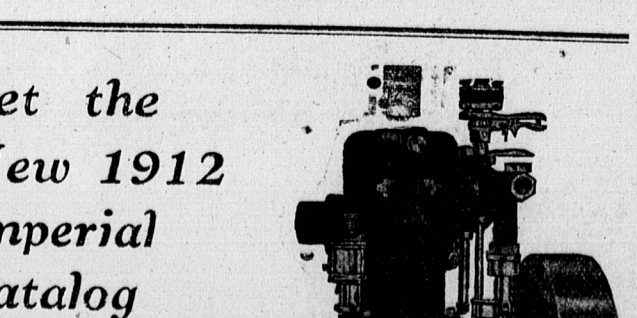
