Some time ago parties in different parts of this Province report d having heard a roll of thunder and seen a distinct flash of lightning in the early hours of the morning. A despatch from Tacoma reports a falling meteor, of which the following is said: "An immense meteor plunging into the earth caused a jar that shook Perce, Thurston, Lewis and Cowlitz counties at a quarter to one o'clock yesterday afternoon. Persons in widely separated parts of the mountain regions report having seen the meteor. The shock rattled windows in Wilkeson, forty miles away, and jarred intervening points. North Puyallup residents reported seeing what seemed a lightning bolt shoot from a mass of clouds like a streak of flame. A. J. Prathers, a pioneer farmer of Lincoln Creek, near Centralia, describes the visitant as a diagonal blaze of white light running athwart the sky like a calcium streak, followed by a hazy stream of apparently gaseous formation. The stream vanished almost as soon as it was sighted, midway between Centralia and Tacoma. Several of those who saw the phenomena in this Province at the time said it was similar to a meteor, but whether there is any connection between the two or not is a matter of conjecture.
