THE COOK'S CORNER

LETTERSWEET CHOCOLATE FROSTING

8 squares unsweetened chocolate
1 cup sugar
2-3 cup water
Melt chocolate in double boiler. Bring sugar and water to a boil. Cool until lukewarm. Add gradually to chocolate, stirring until blended. Cool, stirring occasionally.

Mo-ha Creole Frosting

1-3 cup butter
4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
1-2 teaspoon vanilla
1-4 teaspoon salt
3 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted
1-2 cup strong coffee
Cream butter thoroughly, add part of sugar gradually, then add remainder. Add vanilla, salt, and chocolate and mix well. Add remaining sugar, alternately with coffee, until all is used. Beat after each addition until smooth. Make a cup of frosting to cover top and sides of two 8-inch cakes (generously) or about 3 dozen cup cakes of medium size.

All-Around Chocolate Frosting

4 tablespoons butter
1-2 teaspoon confectioners' sugar
3-4 teaspoon vanilla
3 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted
4-4 tablespoons hot milk (about 1-4 cup)
1-4 teaspoon salt
Cream butter well, and part of sugar gradually, bending after each addition. Add vanilla, salt, and chocolate and mix well. Add remaining sugar, alternately with milk, until all is used. Beat after each addition until mixture is smooth. Make a cup of frosting to cover top and sides of two 8-inch cakes (generously) or about 3 dozen cup cakes.

RED SAILS IN THE MOONLIGHT

This frosting and other butter frostings of similar type, when used on special cakes, force through pastry tubes or bag, filling tube or bag only half full of frosting, at a time.
