THE CAPITAL OF THE WEST

Latest From Summerside and Prince County.

Amongst the shipments by Northumberland yesterday were seven horses, five of which were shipped by J. A. Ramsay and two by John A. McDonald.

Hon. R. C. McLeod, is in receipt of a letter from the Government Engineer Shewen, advising that he expects to be at Cape Tormentine on the 24th inst. and asking Mr. McLeod to meet him there to talk over matters respecting the proposed construction of a protecting pier at Cape Tormentine in connection with the winter communication of the straits. Owing to the illness of Mr. McLeod it is expected that a delegation from the Board of Trade will be sent to the Capes on that date for the purpose of conferring with the engineer.

A FIRE was discovered a few minutes before eight o'clock yesterday morning in the Yacht Club Room which necessitated the firemen's attention for some little time. The fire gained little headway but was difficult to exactly locate owing to the amount of smoke. It was successfully quenched, however, before much had been burned. Besides a slight loss to the Yacht Club, Messrs. Small & Bearfoote, whose store is below, are the chief losers. J. A. Gourlie also below suffers considerably through goods being damaged by water and smoke. The fire is supposed to have started from a cigar or cigarette having been dropped into a cuspidor containing sawdust during the previous evening.

A YOUNG man named McLean died from exposure after shipwreck off St. Mark's, Lot 7, on Thursday night last. In company with John Griffin, in whose boat he was a fishing hand, he went out to attend the trawls in the evening. A squall upset the boat at dark and they were obliged to cling to its bottom all night. Coming on morning McLean died of exposure and his body fell over into the sea near Cape Wolf. In the morning the boat was dashed on the rocks and Griffin, much exhausted, climbed up the steep bank and to the nearest house, where in a very precarious state he was cared for tenderly. The body of McLean, who was an orphan brought up by Thomas Milligan, Lot 11, was found on Sunday morning last and buried.
