Stock Prices Close Strong In New York

(By FREDERICK GARDINER Associated Press Financial Writer)

NEW YORK, April 11.—(AP)—Relaxed buying power came into the stock market today and reduced or converted into modest advances early losses running to more than five points.

The Associated Press average of 90 stocks, down more than a point at midday, came back to finish with a decline of 1 of a point at 4:25. Transfers totaled 1,692,530 shares against 1,946,080 the day before.

In the Canadian Department the mid-afternoon upswing failed to wipe out completely the morning losses. McIntyre dropped 1 1/8 points to 49 3/8 while International Nickel, Brazillian, Ford, Hollinger and Imperial Oil and Lake Shore finished slightly stronger.

Under fractions to a point or so at the finish were Chrysler, General Motors, American Telephone, Douglas Aircraft, Kennecott, Du Pont, Union Carbide, J. I. Case and Chesapeake and Ohio.

Endings of 25 to 30 as much were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Sears Roebuck, Sperry, Johns Manville, Consolidated Edison, N. Y. Central Great Northern and Standard Oil of N. J.

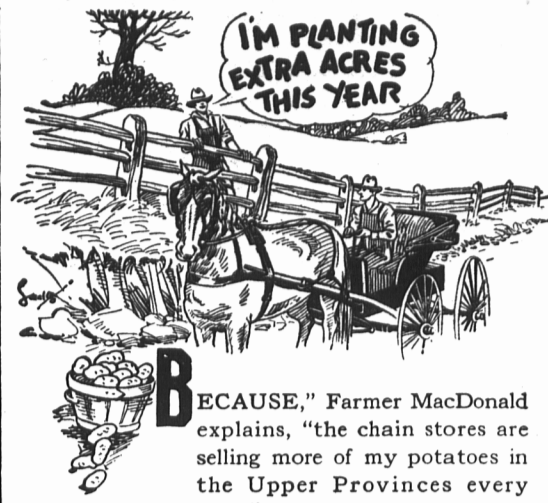

GRAIN

WINNIPEG, April 11.—(CP)—Scattered selling late in today's session at Winnipeg erased early gains made by wheat futures traders and pushed the market below the previous close. Final quotations were 1-2-1-4 cent lower, with May at 60 5/8, July 61 1/2 and Oct. 62 5/8 cents.

Operations in the coarse grains pit indicated barley and oats were going into strong hands while cash wheat track uncovered a little support in the lower grades.
