**CONSOLIDATION OF NEW YORK CENTRAL.**

NEW YORK, December 22—What is regarded in Wall Street as the first step in the long rumored plan to consolidate the subsidiaries of the New York Central system with the Parent company was taken today, when the New York Central and Hudson river railroad company addressed letters to the holders of its \$110,000,000, 3 1/2 per cent collateral trust bonds which were given in exchange for stock of the Lake Shore and Michigan Southern and Michigan Central roads, asking their consent to merge or both roads with the Parent company.

The bond holders are asked to relinquish their lien upon the Lake Shore and Michigan Central stock pledged as security for the bonds and accept in return what will be practically second mortgage bonds on the consolidated system which it is stated are a better security than the collateral trust bonds which they relinquish. Several other New York Central lines, south of Chicago, and in Lake Shore territory will be merged with the Parent company when the Lake Shore is taken in.

R. will be interested in the following from a Halifax exchange: A Mosher, grand president of the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway Employees, recently returned from the Northwest, has this to say about Samuel Gompers and the charges made against him by Detective Burns in connection with the dynamiting outrages in the United States: "In my opinion it is now up to Mr. Gompers to take action compelling Mr. Burns to substantiate his very serious charges or to retract them; and, moreover, it is up to organized labor in the United States to see that he does so, or that he is put out of the presidency." As for the McNamara's, labor feels ashamed of them and only regrets what it considers the inadequacy of their punishment." Mr. Mosher brings from the west a most encouraging report as to the growth of the Brotherhood of Railway Employees and the enthusiasm of the branches.
