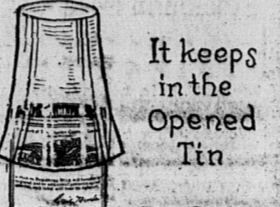
Her gaze roamed around the living-room in search of a weapon. It fell upon the fire-rod which she seized in nervous fingers as she backed against the wall near the hearth.

When she opened the door to him and he stepped into the warm, fire-lit room, shivering, she said:



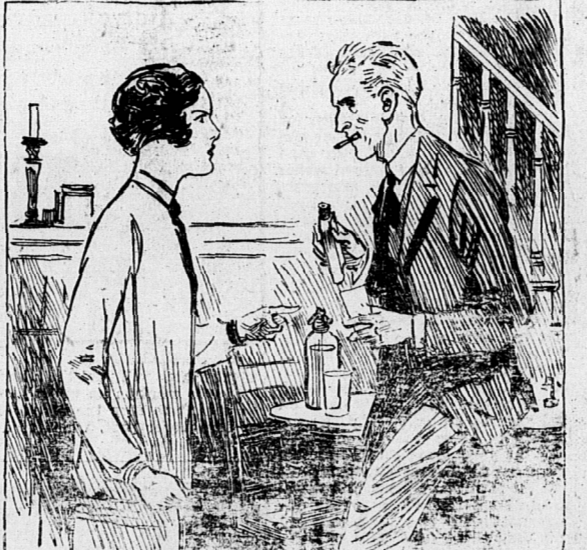
