NEW YORK, Aug. 1—The first application for the insurance of new stock for shares lost with the Titanic has just been passed upon by the State Court here, on a meeting by a firm of brokers for an order compelling the New York Central Railroad to issue a new certificate for 100 shares sent from London by registered mail on that steamship. The court granted the order.
