**Contract Bridge**

**THE BETTER PLAN**

South might well have reached a safer game contract in today's deal, but he might also have played his actual contract more shrewdly.

East dealer.  
 North-South vulnerable.

♠ A 8 5 3  
 ♥ A 4 3  
 ♦ Q J 8  
 ♣ 7 5 2

The bidding:  
 East South West North

Three notrump would have been a laydown, and especially if played from the South position, would not even have been open to a possible one club suit in the opponents' hands. However, the actual bidding was not illogical; partners frequently cannot help going past three notrump in searching for what may appear to be one or the other as the "right spot."

West opened the heart queen. South won in his own hand, drew trumps in two leads, then led a low spade from dummy with the hope of passing the trick to west. Then, if spades broke 3-3, South could discard a club on dummy's long ace and in that way avoid any unpleasantness in the club suit. The position of spades, however, made it impossible for South to pass the trick to west, and he finally had to fall back upon a lead up to his club king. The off-side position of the ace defeated.

Due to the low "spot" in the North-South spade suit aside from the two tops, South should have realized that he might have had trouble in keeping East off lead, and a far sounder plan was available. South should have conceded the first trick to West! West could then do no better than lead another heart. South would win the king, draw trumps, and then discard a spade on dummy's heart ace. Now he could cash the king and ace of spades and ruff a third round—and if he found the fortunate 3-3 break, as he would have, he could then discard his club. At worst, he would still be able to try for the club trick if the spade break failed.
