PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 6 (AP)—Helmeted, rifle-carrying soldiers guarded every vehicle that moved through Philadelphia's public transportation system today with every indication that full service would be resumed tomorrow after a five-day unauthorized strike paralyzed the United States' third largest city, crippled war production and caused race violence.

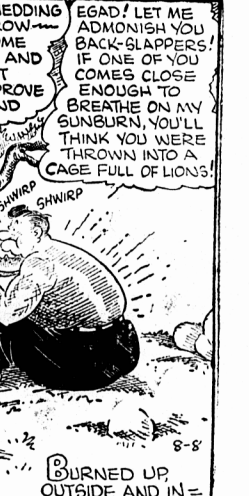

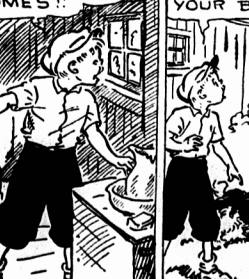
