A FOREIGN MAIL arrived in the city yesterday by special train at 1.30 p. m., having been brought to Summerside by the S. S. Empress which left Pt. du Chene at 6 a. m. The Empress left on return for Pt. du Chene yesterday afternoon taking the out-going mail. She arrived safely, although there is a good deal of ice reported in the straits, and again left Pt. du Chene at eight o'clock last night for Summerside. The regular mail train however, had left Summerside at 7.55 p. m. for Charlottetown, and thus there was no train to connect with the Empress on her arrival and bring the mail and passengers to Charlottetown—consequently they will not arrive in the city till 1 p. m. today. It appears that no official knowledge of the movements of the mails was in possession of either the Railway or Post Office officials.—The Guardian being informed of the fact by its Summerside correspondent.
