**LAKE WINNIPEG**  
Of the lakes of Manitoba Lake Winnipeg is the largest, being 275 miles long and from 40 to 60 miles wide, its area being about 9,000 square miles and its total length line longer than that of any of the great lakes except Lake Superior. No other province or state has entirely within its boundaries a body of water of all approaching it in magnitude. Great Salt Lake, in Utah, is only one-fifth of the extent of Lake Winnipeg. The largest of its tributaries is the Saskatchewan river, one of the four great continental divide. Its total length is 1,090 miles. The Red river, 700 miles in length, and the Winnipeg river, 300 miles in length, and many minor rivers also pour into Lake Winnipeg. The Nelson river is its principal outlet and connects it with Hudson Bay.
