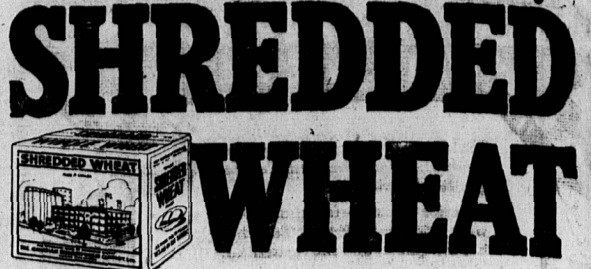
Miss Mary Gallant, New Acadia has returned home from Charlottetown where she recently underwent an operation for appendicitis.

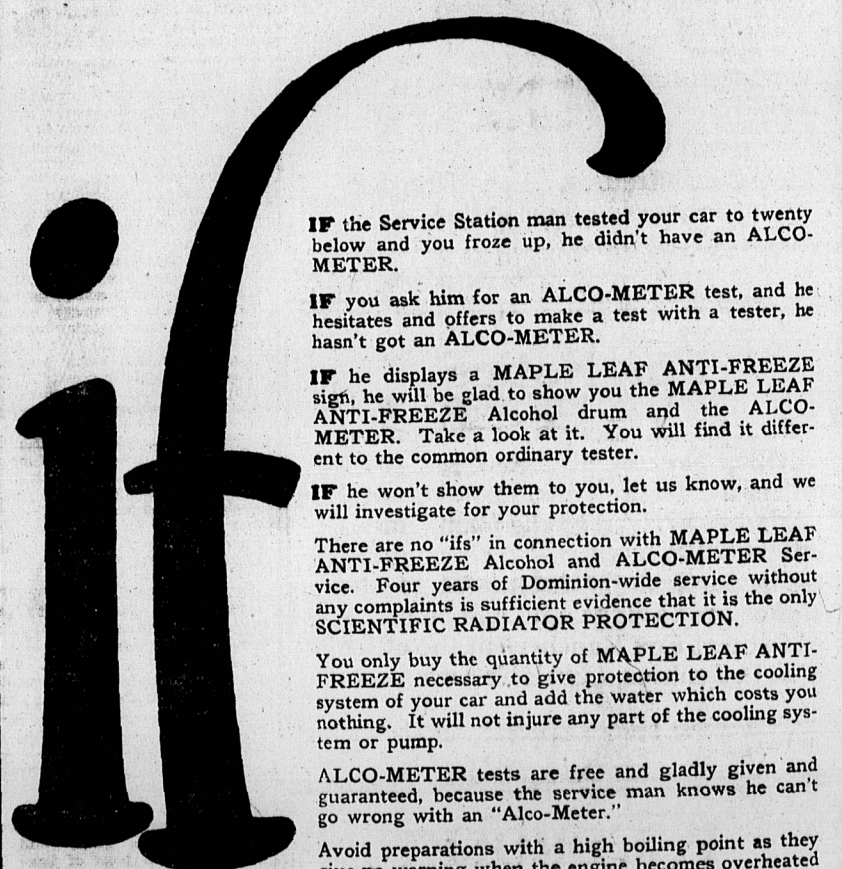
