"Big trader" in the mines today was Central Cadillac, which added four cents on a turnover of 133,900 shares. Heaviest individual gainer among selected golds was Louvicourt, which closed ahead 12 cents at 1.38. Hollinger with a turnover of 6,680 shares, closed up 7-8 point.

Other gainers in the mines were East Sullivan 10 cents, Beaulieu 6, Sullivan 4, Formaque 3, Beaulieu 1-2 and Century Mining 1. Exceptions to the trend were C'Brien and Sherritt-Gordon off five cents each, and Quebec Manganese, with a turnover of 47,600 shares, off four.
