PRODUCE

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, June 1—Increased stocks in storage caused prices on the Montreal dairy and produce market to ease slightly today. Butter and eggs were affected while cheese, potatoes and poultry were unchanged. Egg prices were generally quoted at 16 1/2 to 16 3/4 cents for extras, 14 1/2 to 14 3/4 for firsts and 12 1/2 to 12 3/4 cents for seconds in cartons or less. Receipts were 1,890 cases. Butter prices for cartons or less were 18 1/2 to 18 3/4 cents a pound for no 1 regraded. A total of 468 boxes were offered. The cheese market was unaltered at 10 1/2 to 10 3/4 cents for current Ontario colored. Offerings were 1,132 boxes. Prices for New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island green mountain potatoes were steady at \$1 to \$1.10 per 80 pound bag.
