1. Mr. MacDonald to retain office as Prime Minister with Lord Sankey, the Lord Chancellor, and Rt. Hon. J. H. Thomas, Secretary for the Dominions, as his National Labor colleagues.

2. Resignation of "Iron Chancellor" Viscount Snowden.

3. Resignations of Sir Herbert Samuel, Sir Archibald Sinclair, and seven junior free trader Ministers including Lord Lothian, Parliamentary Under Secretary for India.

4. Resignation of Walter Runciman, President of the Board of Trade, Sir John Simon, Foreign Secretary.

Danger In The House

Lord Snowden retained with Mr. MacDonald when the great majority of Labor ministers declined to adopt the report's recommendations, and went out of office Nov. Lord Snowden is at the crossroads.

Legislation ratifying the Ottawa agreements is in no danger in the House of Commons. Nor in the House of Lords. The Conservative majority in either House is so staggering as to put the possibility of defeat out of the question.

But the cabinet meeting on Wednesday will decide whether it will be put through the House with the bulk of the National Cabinet supporting it and the remainder of the cabinet taking no sides, or will be put through against strenuous opposition from the Labor opposition and a redoubtable band of Liberals—erstwhile ministers.

Carlot Prices of Graded Fresh Show Substantial Gains—Extras Advance Two To Three Cents.

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Sept. 27.—Upturn in egg prices featured the produce and dairy market here today. Carlot prices of graded fresh eggs showed substantial gains. Extras advanced two to three cents at 28 to 31 cents, firsts were up one to two cents at 20 to 22 cents and seconds rose one to one and a half cents at 14 to 15 cents a dozen.
