THE monument in memory of the late lamented pastor of Zion Church is about completed, and it will be placed in position in the People's Cemetery next week. Mr. E. F. Purdy is the contractor and the cost of the work is understood to be about \$200. The monument is of Scotch granite, and is in the round cottage style. It will stand eleven feet high, including the bases, and is surmounted by an urn. The tracing and lettering has been well done. The inscription is as follows: "Erected by friends and admirers to the memory of the Rev. David Sutherland, pastor of Zion Church. Born in Bruan, Caithness, Scotland, died July 8th, 1898."

### IN CHINA

Rev. J. Bradshaw, Formerly of Bedeque.

### IN THE MISSION FIELD

Tells Something of His Work as a Missionary Among the Natives.

We are in receipt of a letter received by a friend from Rev. J. Bradshaw formerly of Bedeque, but now a missionary in Kiating, West China, dated April 11th. Mr. Bradshaw graduated some eight years ago from Acadia University, Wolfville, and has been engaged as a missionary in Central China for some four years. In the letter he says: "I have just left a bed of la grippe and bronchitis and find many of the Chinese waiting for me and the medicine box, coughing with the same disease. It is pleasant and sweet to be able to serve them. I often wish I had taken a regular course in medicine. The people here have given me the name of raising the dead. Some people have certainly been saved after being given over by all the native doctors. I have had but one case lately, so perhaps they will begin to think they have given me credit for too much. We have now two very interesting enquirers, both of them have been addicted to the opium habit and are trying to break it off. The opium habit is one of the great curses of China. It is sapping the very life out of the people, and it is growing at an alarming rate.

A reform is being started under the name of the Young Emperor. While they have all been upset by his crafty old aunt, who has long been waiting for the hour and opportunity to seize the throne. But the tide has only receded to return with greater energy. It cannot altogether be stopped. Thousands of the best people of the empire are awaiting the end and it is bound to come."

Mr. Bradshaw does not intend to return to Canada for some time, unless his health becomes impaired.
